Bio for Dr. Rachel Wrenn

Dean Wrenn teaches biblical studies at Trinity Lutheran Seminary. Her research interests include the Psalms, biblical bodies and emotions, divine-human relationships, and Old Testament roots of the New Testament. Dr. Wrenn has published multiple articles on anger in the Psalms and in liturgies.

Dr. Wrenn is an ordained Lutheran (ELCA) pastor. A sought-after presenter, she often speaks at pastoral gatherings and lay church conferences. Dr. Wrenn has also written multiple articles on biblical commentary and preaching for WorkingPreacher.org. She is the co-host of the podcast First Reading, an Old Testament lectionary podcast for preachers and teachers of the Bible (https://firstreadingpodcast.com/). Dr. Wrenn invites and challenges her students to experience both the delights and the difficulties of the biblical text.

News of Embrace Ministries

Audit Team to Lead Discernment around Employee Retention Tax Credit

Along with other churches and businesses across the country, Holy Trinity applied for an Employee Retention Tax Credit [ERTC] from the Internal Revenue Service [IRS] in December 2023. The congregation qualified for an ERTC because our income over the second, third and fourth quarters of 2020 as well as the first, second and third quarters of 2021 was less than the same quarters in 2019.

Due to a backlog in applications, the IRS didn't process our application until July 2025, at which time we received a credit in the form of checks totaling \$283,794.41. That amount has been temporarily deposited to the church's Special Gifts Fund. Holy Trinity's Audit Team will be leading Council's discernment of a faithful way to share, apply and invest those funds across ministries of the congregation and preschool alike, each of which retained its staff leadership during the course of the pandemic. That discernment will be reported as part of the 2025 Annual Meeting that will be conducted on Sunday, January 25, 2026. Co-chairs of the Audit Team are Council Treasurer Nicole Carothers and Financial Secretary Peter Ward.

Social Justice Parenting, We Are Not Broken, and On Savage Shores: How Indigenous Americans Discovered Europe are books of note. This literature intends to expand our awareness, theology and/or acceptance of diverse viewpoints. We in Neighbor-to-Neighbor hope you'll discover how these writings from various generations embrace what it means to be human and to walk in spirit. ...

Social Justice Parenting by Baxley, Traci.

So often, this diversity professor suggests, parents make choices based on what's best for their children, versus what's best for all children in their community. Dr. Baxley helps readers take inventory of their actions and beliefs, develop self-awareness and accountability, and become role models.

We Are Not Broken by Johnson, George

This is the vibrant story of George, Garrett, Rall, and Rasul--four children raised by their fiercely devoted grandmother. The boys hold each other close through early brushes with racism, memorable experiences at the family barbershop, and first loves and losses. And with Nanny at their center, they are never broken. George M. Johnson captures the unique experience of growing up as a Black boy in America through rich family stories that explore themes of vulnerability, sacrifice, and culture. For senior high and older readers.

On Savage Shores: How Indigenous Americans Discovered Europe by Dodds Pennock, Caroline. From the Brazilian king who met Henry VIII to the Aztecs who mocked up human sacrifice at the court of Charles V; from the Inuk baby who was put on show in a London pub to the mestizo children of Spaniards

who returned "home" with their fathers; from the Inuit who harpooned ducks on the Avon river to the many servants employed by Europeans of every rank: here are a people who were rendered exotic, demeaned, and marginalized, but whose worldviews and cultures had a profound impact on European civilization. Drawing on their surviving literature and poetry and subtly layering European eyewitness accounts against the grain, Pennock gives us a sweeping account of the Indigenous American presence in, and impact on, early modern Europe.
