A Message from Our Pastor

What is church membership, and why does it matter?

I know that St. Mary's, and many other churches, have used the term "member" for a long time. However, the whole idea of being a "member" of a faith community can be a bit problematic.

Why is this? One reason is that it flattens out a rich, nuanced part of our life together, making it sound consumeristic. I am a member at Costco, which means I can go there and buy toilet paper and breakfast cereal at a discounted price. As a member at Costco, I primarily think about my own needs and wants, rather than the well-being of the company or the common good.

When we term something as a "membership," it implies that we expect certain things to result from that membership—that because we (usually) pay some amount of money to be a member of something or other, we are entitled to certain benefits in return. This could look like thinking that St. Mary's owes us something, be it a certain kind of worship style, a convenient fit with our schedule, or for faith to be more comforting than it is challenging.

The relationship that we hope to be in at St. Mary's is actually called discipleship. I did not create the chart below, but did modify it in the hopes that it will be helpful.

Membership vs. Discipleship

Membership	Discipleship
Primary relationship is with the congregation	Primary relationship is with the divine
Gives money to support the ministry	Does ministry, because ministry is a partnership, not just paying the pastor to do things
Be a good citizen	Live life in community
Assumptions of membership:	Assumptions of discipleship:
The work of ministry primarily takes place within the building or community of the church.	The work of ministry primarily takes place beyond the walls of the church.
The goal of the congregation is to get and keep members and money.	The goal is to help people grow in their relationship to God/Jesus, and in serving the community.
Congregations tend to have low expectations of members, because if we expect too much, people will not join.	There are high expectations of disciples.

That being said, "member" is a commonly used term, and I'm not going to invent a new one.

So what does it mean to be a member of St. Mary's?

Here is what St. Mary's constitution has to say about membership:

- * Baptized members have been either baptized at St. Mary's, or received into the membership of St. Mary's from another congregation.
- Confirmed members have been baptized and have later affirmed the faith that their family had them baptized into.
- Voting members are people who have been confirmed, and who, during the current or preceding calendar year, have taken communion and made a contribution of record (of any amount) to St. Mary's. Voting members who have satisfied these standards may speak and vote at every regular (monthly) or special (i.e., called for a particular purpose) meeting of the congregation.

That is a somewhat formal way of saying that, as a member, you have the privilege and responsibility of being part of this community of faith.

St. Mary's Lutheran Church has a long and proud legacy of supporting the Kenosha community, of nurturing face across generations, and of offering a spiritual home to many. I hope that St. Mary's Lutheran Church is a place where you feel accepted and included, with all of your questions, doubts, faith, and joys. I hope you feel the support of both God and this community of faith as you go through your life.

I hope that St. Mary's gives a great deal to you, *and* that you will consider what you can give to St. Mary's.

As people—and people of faith—we need to give. It is built into the way God made us. We are meant to be in mutual relationship with God and with each other.

Giving—of money, time, and other things—is primarily an act of faith and generosity, and not something to do simply so the church can survive. Giving is an important way we live as disciples of Jesus Christ.

As you seek to live out your discipleship, how can you play an active part in the life of St. Mary's?

That might look like:

- volunteering to serve on a ministry team
- being willing to serve on church council
- helping to support the faith formation of people of any age at St. Mary's

There is no right or wrong answer to how you give to St. Mary's and the wider community, but it is a worthwhile question to consider—and then to act upon.

May the Holy Spirit guide each of us as individuals, and all of us as a community, for the mutual flourishing of St. Mary's, Kenosha, and this whole world that God loves so much.



NURSE SUE—ADVOCATE FAITH & HEALTH—SEPTEMBER 2025

Dear friends,

As we roll into September, we are reminded of new beginnings as school buses appear on our streets. Students have moved into the next grade level, and the learning process continues. As adults we too need to be mindful of continued learning and the promotion of healthy aging at any age.

Healthy aging is the process of maintaining good physical, mental, and social health and well-being as we grow older. Healthy aging is not just for adults. It means adopting healthy habits and making positive lifestyle choices that contribute to overall well-being as we age.

Habits such as:

Physical activity – Walking at least 30 minutes a day can be beneficial. If you are sitting at a job ...stand up every 20 minutes (5-10 times up and down off your chair) or march while sitting (moving each leg 10 times), stretch your legs out simultaneously 5-10 times, lift your heel to toe to increase blood supply to legs, stretch your arms back and move neck from side to side.

Nutrition – Maintain a healthy, balanced diet consisting of proteins, fruits, vegetables, grains, fats/oils and dairy products. Keep hydrated with water throughout the day. Mental Functioning – Keep your mind stimulated and get enough sleep (7- 8 hours a night)

Social well-being – Stay socially connected and engaged with others. Small group activities are always helpful as we build relationships. Having meaningful conversations with others can be very beneficial.

Emotional well-being -Take care of your emotional well-being, including managed stress, having a positive outlook, striving to find gratitude thoughts for the day and seek support when needed.

Injury prevention – Try to avoid falls (wear sturdy shoes) and other injuries by taking precautions and practicing safe driving and following the rules of the road.

Health care routine – Keep up with regular health checkups, vaccines (the flu vaccine is coming out soon!) and screenings: and manage any chronic conditions such as hypertension and diabetes to name a few.

Enjoy the beautiful fall weather and all the new programming for the fall season. Take care of yourself, you are worth it!


bring your bags and put them in the special container provided. It is located by the entry doors or in fellowship hall. If you have personal care items you would like to donate, they can be put in there as well.
