

Have you ever wondered what it feels like to be truly listened to? Or how to listen to others without judgement or the need to fix?

Julia will be hosting a Listening Circle for six Wednesdays starting September 24th from 3-5 p.m. at Okotoks United in the Chapel.

A *Listening Circle* is a group of people who meet to listen to each other's lives and to oneself, provide discerning questions and nurturing feedback. Each session will have a clear format and specific guidelines for the process. The purpose is to learn to listen deeply, NOT to judge or find solutions to anything.

Learning this process hones not only listening skills but the ability to be with people in all situations. It teaches participants how to listen mindfully. The group will be limited to six participants so please speak to Julia directly if you wish to participate.

Remember who you are and also remember that honoring that which is allows greater understanding of what is possible.


DATES! Workshop Oct 24-25, 2025
