S.O.A.P Journal: Luke 14:25-30

Scripture:

"Large crowds were travelling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. 'Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, saying, "This person began to build and wasn't able to finish."

<u>Observe:</u> What grabs your attention? Are there links to other parts of the Bible? How does it connect to the context of the chapter?

<u>Apply:</u> What does this mean for me? How might it challenge me? How might it comfort me?

Pray: Record any prayer points that have surfaced through your study.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Jesus said : Anyone who does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. (Luke 14:27)

This means that we sometimes have to do things that we don't want to do or that are hard. Think of one 'hard thing' you could attempt this week as a follower of Jesus.

For example: be friendly to someone who has no friends, make peace with someone you may not get along with very well, work on a bad habit.

Make a small cross out of wire (or some other type of material) and carry it in your pocket as a reminder of Jesus' words.



ACTION RESPONSE

St Paul gave his love, care and support to a young man called Onesimus whom he met in prison.

Who in your community is experiencing hard times due to illness, loss of work or separation from family? Choose people who will be for you the 'ONES I MUSt serve' this week. Make them a meal, do an act of service for them (e.g. mow the lawn, clean their home) or offer friendship to them.
