
I'm reminded of Romans 12:11-12:

## **Celebrating Hymn History: Blessed Assurance**

As we continue to celebrate the rich history of hymns, we turn our attention this month to one of the most cherished hymns of all time—"Blessed Assurance."

Written in 1873 by the legendary hymn writer **Fanny J. Crosby**, with music by **Phoebe P. Knapp**, this hymn has become a cornerstone of Christian worship around the world. Its enduring popularity is a testament not only to its beautiful melody and poetic lyrics but also to the deep theological truths it proclaims.

Fanny Crosby, who lost her sight as an infant, is one of the most prolific hymnists in history, credited with writing over 8,000 hymns. Her blindness never hindered her spiritual insight. In fact, many believe it deepened her faith. "Blessed Assurance" is a perfect example of how her words were born from a deep and personal walk with Christ.

The story behind the hymn is as moving as the song itself. One day, Phoebe Knapp played a new melody for Crosby and asked, "What does this tune say to you?" Without hesitation, Crosby responded, "Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine!" From that moment, a hymn was born—one that would inspire countless believers for generations.


The lyrics speak of a personal relationship with Jesus and the peace that comes from knowing we are secure in His love:

Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine! Oh, what a foretaste of glory divine!

Heir of salvation, purchase of God, Born of His Spirit, washed in His blood.

As we celebrate hymn history, "Blessed Assurance" reminds us why these songs matter. They are not just melodies we sing—they are testimonies of faith passed down through time. They connect us with the saints who have gone before us and inspire us to live lives of worship today.

Next time you sing "Blessed Assurance," take a moment to reflect on the story behind the song—and give thanks for the gift of hymn writers like Fanny Crosby, whose faithful witness continues to bless the church.


## **Week Night Meat Loaf**

#### **Ingredients**

- · 4 slices white bread, torn into pieces
- 2½ pounds ground beef
- 1 medium yellow onion, peeled & cut into eighths
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2 stalks celery, cut into 2-inch pieces
- 2 carrots, peeled and cut into 2-inch pieces
- ½ cup flat-leaf parsley leaves
- 1 large egg
- 1 cup ketchup
- 3 teaspoons dry mustard
- 1 tablespoon coarse salt
- 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar

#### **Directions**

- 1. Heat oven to 375 degrees. Place bread in the bowl of a food processor fitted with the steel blade; pulse until fine crumbs form. Transfer to a medium bowl, and add ground beef.
- 2. Place onion, garlic, celery, carrots, and parsley in the bowl of a food processor fitted with the steel blade; pulse until fine. Add to meat mixture, using hands to mix well. Add egg, 1/2 cup ketchup, 2 teaspoons dry mustard, salt, and pepper; use hands to combine thoroughly. Place in an 8 1/2-by-4 1/2-by-2 1/2-inch loaf pan.
- 3. Combine remaining 1/2 cup ketchup, remaining teaspoon dry mustard, and brown sugar in a bowl; stir until smooth.
- 4. Brush mixture over meatloaf; place in the oven with a baking pan set on the rack below to catch drippings. Cook until a meat thermometer inserted in the center reads 160 degrees, about 90 minutes. If top gets too dark, cover with foil, and continue baking.
