I can feel the constant undertone of anxiety slowly lessen as each task is checked off the list. I pray that all will be well. There is a time for everything. I have been truly blessed to serve alongside such faithful, dedicated and supportive people. My humble prayer is that hopefully, over these ten years, I have helped some of you, in some small way, on your spiritual journey with Christ. As a priest, my main aim is always to help people connect to God through the Word, prayer, sacraments and service. Perhaps some of you may

even remember some of the messages I've tried to convey in my preaching? 'Eh?"


