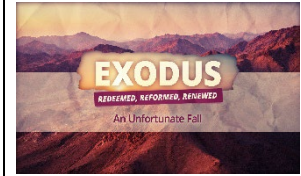

<p>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with Prayer -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>Read the Text</u> -Exodus 32</p> <p><u>Questions for Reflection & Discussion:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In verse 1, it tells us that, “when the people saw that Moses delayed” they began to get anxious and worry. How do worry, fear, anxiety, suspicion, doubt, and speculation cultivate sin and idolatry in communities? 2. How does Aaron, the temporarily assigned leader of the people, fuel the people’s desire for an idol? What could he have done that would have brought hope and comfort to the people? How does Aaron’s behavior demonstrate he was fearing man above God? (vss. 2-6). 3. What is the lie that Aaron proclaims among the people? (vss. 4,8) How does this lie distract and disorient people from the truth? Where do we see or hear this same lie in our culture today? 4. Discuss Moses’ intercession. What can we learn from his pattern or example to go before God on behalf of the people? How can the church participate in and practice the art of intercessory prayer today? Why is intercessory prayer effective? (vss. 9-14) 5. Who or what are the idols of our culture today? How do we fall into their lies and trappings? Where are their lies propagated and proclaimed? Where can we find or how can we establish routines, rhythms, or patterns in our lives that remind and rehearse the truth that God is more than able, and Jesus is enough? 6. How can we love and care for those who are trapped in the grip of sin and idolatry? What might our attitudes, postures, behaviors, and words communicate to them about the One, the Way, the Truth, the Life, Jesus who is truly able to set them/us free? <p><u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation & Application:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are we motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating us to apply some of the principles from this passage to our families, careers, communities, or churches? 4. How might Jesus be using us to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
