

31 Days of Prayer for our Neighbors

May 2022

Do you truly know your neighbors? Do you know their names, children's names, their profession(s), their daily obstacles, challenges, or sources of joy? What are their family dynamics? Can you identify what encourages or uplifts their spirits when they are down? Do they attend a local church? If not, do you know why? Have they ever heard of Jesus? How do they relate to him?

On Sunday, May 1, we will begin a 31-day prayer challenge focused on loving our neighbors and building our relationships with them. During these 31 days, we are calling our faith community at CMBC to personal and intentional prayer for each and every one of our literal neighbors. For this particular challenge we are defining our neighbors as the people who live on our street, across our street, or even across our fields or forests. We are asking us all to consider, "What if Jesus was serious when he said that one of the greatest commands was to love our neighbors as ourselves?" Or, what if Paul was serious when he said, "For the whole law can be summed up in this one command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself?'" Our prayer is that through this 31-day challenge, God will move our hearts towards our literal neighbors, growing our love for them through prayer.

There will be three options for you to receive daily prayer content. Please feel free to sign up for more than one way.

- **1. Reserve your own printed 31-day prayer journal.** Put together by CMBC staff, this journal will serve as a hard copy, walking you through each of the 31 days of prayer. Sign up on the communication form or contact Beth in the office (bcortez@calvarymonument.org).
- **2. Sign up to be part of our 31 Days of Prayer email group.** Each day, members of this group will receive an email in the morning with their prayer content found in the email. Sign up on the <u>communication form</u> or contact Beth in the office (<u>bcortez@calvarymonument.org</u>).
- 3. Receive daily prayer content through our CMBC app. You can find the CMBC app, and download it for free, in the App Store (iPhone users), or Google Play store (Android users). Make sure you opt in for notifications! This content will be available on the app even if you prefer not to get notifications just open your app on May 1!

Finally, we desire for this 31 Days of Prayer to supplement, not overtake, your current daily prayer habits and practices. Please continue to make use of your monthly prayer calendar (to pray for our congregation, ministries, and global partners) and weekly Intercessor (to pray for more pressing and time sensitive needs within our body) alongside of, and together with, your 31 day prayer journal.

Both of these documents can be found in our foyer and are regularly available to our CMBC family. Thank you for praying together with us. We look forward to beginning our 31 days of corporate prayer starting on Sunday, May 1!
