Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>READ THE TEXT</u> – Mark 6:30-7:37 (or portions)</p> <p><u>QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION & DISCUSSION:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. When Jesus passes by the disciples on the water, they are terrified. What are the words that he speaks to them? (vs. 50) Why are these words comforting for disciples of Jesus today? How should these words inform our collective witness in the world today? 2. In Chapter 7, Jesus is interrogated by the Pharisees for breaking their traditions. How does Jesus prioritize the authority of God’s Word above the traditions of the religious leaders? (vss. 6-7; 8-10) 3. How does Jesus illustrate the failure of the religious leaders to comply with and obey the law? (8-12) How does Jesus imply that this is only one example of many? 4. Spend some time in discussion regarding Jesus’ teaching on defilement. Sometimes, we confuse this and mix it up, thinking that things from the outside are more of a threat than those things that already exist within our own hearts. (vss. 14-23) How do Jesus’ words remind us that the greatest threats to our own flourishing, and the flourishing of our Christian communities, exist already in our own hearts? 5. In what ways could misunderstanding Jesus’ teaching on defilement keep us from fulfilling the command and commission that we have been given? <p><u>QUESTIONS GUIDING SPIRITUAL FORMATION & APPLICATION:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are we motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating us to apply some of the principles from this passage to our families, careers, communities, or churches? 4. How might Jesus be using us to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
