There has not been a time when we have had more opportunity to have access to information. David Schilling noted that "until 1900 human knowledge doubled approximately every century... But [now] on average human knowledge is doubling every 13 months. According to IBM, the build out of the 'internet of things' will lead to the doubling of knowledge every 12 hours."
