<p>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with Prayer -ask Jesus to guide your time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p>Read the Text -read the text together. (1 Cor. 15:35-49)</p> <p>Discussion Guiding Questions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Reflect on Paul's use of the seed illustration. How does this illustration shed light on the end of our physical bodies on earth, and the beginning of our eternal, future bodies? (vss. 35-38) 2. Go back and read Genesis 1:1-26. How does considering God's original creative diversity and design, solidify our hope in our future bodily resurrection? What attributes of God shine forth in the creation account, and in our future resurrection? 3. Discuss the contrasts in verses 42-44 in chapter 15. How are our current bodies different than the bodies we will be given in our future resurrection? 4. Compare and contrast Adam and Christ. How were they the same, and how were they different? How is it that we bear the image of both Adam (man of dust) and Jesus (man of Heaven)? (see Gen. 5:3; Rom. 8:28-30). 5. Talk about the implications of bearing the image of Jesus today. What did Jesus call his disciples to do? How can we encourage and build one another up to continue in the call that we have been given? What are some ways that we can walk with one another through difficulty and discouragement along the way? <p>Questions towards Spiritual Growth & Discipleship:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge you to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are you motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating you apply some of the principles from this passage to your family, career, community, or church? 4. How might Jesus be using you to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
