## **Global Outreach Conference**

The 53<sup>rd</sup> annual Global Outreach Conference is scheduled for March 21 to 28. The theme is "Every Nation, Tribe, and Language" from Revelation 14:6. We are still planning on holding it as usual, but we will be prepared to hold it either in person and virtual, or totally virtually if needed. Please pray that God will use whatever format it takes to impact the lives of all of us, to be either GOers or SENDers! Our guests will be: Emmanuel Adomako (via video), HOPE International (Peter Greer), TEAM (Ingrams), Tomorrow Clubs (Martys), Wycliffe (Trostles), and Lemuel Ministries in Haiti (the Muchmores, who were with us 2 years ago, and their daughter Judy).

# **Global Partner Updates & Prayer Requests**

There are many updates and some prayer requests for our global partners that we would like to share with you. Here they are, in random order.

- Hadassah Henry is planning a 2-year missions service in Portugal, leaving this month or February. All her outgoing expenses are in hand, and most of her monthly support is pledged. CMBC Global Ministries committee has contributed significantly to her.
- Our own **Dan Steinman** is working with Handi\*Vangelism in the outreach called BASIS, which is supportive of those who have lost loved ones. Tara Kelley tells me that he is a great asset to the overall ministry of Handi\*Vangelism.
- Ashley and Lauren Rickards are both in training for full-time ministry at Ethnos360 Bible Institute in Wisconsin.
- Don & Millie Ressler served in Alaska for 50 years. A few months ago Millie was in an accident, and is recovering from orthopedic surgeries. They returned here and are living at Calvary Fellowship Homes. Don recently had abdominal surgery, and then had a medical setback.

- Anne Ingram had a hip replacement at LGH and is doing well. The Ingrams will be here for several more months and will be part of our GOC in March.
- R & K have been living in Louisville, but recently have chosen to move from the Arab Affinity group to the North American Affinity group, to make disciples among refugees & internationals in their home area.
- The Trostles will be here, living in our white house for most of 2021, to care for Mark's 82-year-old mother. They will be part of GOC.
- Bud Speck has had inability to speak for weeks.
   He is scheduled for vocal cord surgery.
- Emmanuel Adomako is starting the 2021 discipling class for pastors, after graduating 20+ last year, despite COVID.
- Andy & Tina Gordley and their family are returning to Costa Rica Jan. 6, in a new area of ministry. Andy will be helping individuals and organizations develop small businesses to allow them to be self-sustaining, so they can then serve the Lord. It will also emphasize discipleship training. They also will be starting their own studyabroad business for Christian high school and college students. They need additional monthly support, since they are no longer part of the GAP ministry.
- Lemuel Ministries is an agricultural development and elementary school ministry in a remote part of Haiti. It was started by Judy (daughter of Muchmores) and her husband Manis Dilus.
   Besides the COVID upheaval, they took a big hit from inflation and are struggling. Our committee chose to send them a significant financial gift, which will be matched. We will hear more at GOC.
- The Fletcher family returned to the US and settled in Winston-Salem, NC. They are doing missionary work remotely, focusing on Central & South America.

- **J & T** plan to return to W. Asia in Jan. or Feb. to continue his teaching job. They are asking God to provide additional financial support.
- Samantha & Brandon Hoover are "expecting" a blessing in May 2021.
- The daughter of 24:14 Ministries workers had emergency surgery in Dec. for an insulinproducing tumor on her pancreas. The surgery was successful, but she had a serious setback in the form of pneumonia.
- Bob & Joyce Cutting have been our retired AWANA missionaries. Bob went to be with the Lord Dec. 17, 2020, due to COVID.

# A Focus on Europe

You may have noted that among this year's GOC guests are 3 organizations that work in Europe. You may ask, "Why do we do missionary work in that 'Christian' continent. Doesn't Africa need missionaries more?" Well, that was true many years ago, but now there are more Christians in Latin America and Africa than in the north. The following is an excerpt from European Christian Mission:

"Most Europeans live and die within the shadows of historic churches. Most also die without ever once hearing a clear presentation of the Gospel. Stunningly, many African nations have a deeper knowledge of God and have more vibrant, growing churches, than those in areas of Europe that hundreds of years ago sent the Gospel to the dark African continent. The task of missions is becoming increasingly more challenging and difficult. The vast majority of Europeans have abandoned Christianity ... and literally have no concept of what biblical conversion and a new life through Christ is, because no one has ever told them. Who can deny that Europe is one of the neediest, and most neglected mission fields of the world? For example, there are more Christians in Seoul, South Korea than in all of Serbia, Poland, Bulgaria, and Czech Republic combined."

May CMBC be a church that prays for Europe and sends out missionaries so that Europe's perishing souls can be won for Christ.
