Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>Read the Text</u> -read the text together. (1 Cor. 11:17-34)</p> <p><u>Discussion Guiding Questions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Paul says that the people of God in Corinth were coming together for the worse, what patterns or behaviors was he observing, or made aware of, that caused him to say this? (vss. 17-22). 2. As the people gathered to participate in the Lord's Supper, Paul identifies, in verse 22, how the division among them made itself evident. What exactly was going on that was so out of place? 3. How does this kind of behavior and attitude present itself in our churches today? 4. When we participate together in the Lord's Supper, what is the message that we are proclaiming? (vss. 23-26) 5. In verses 27-34 Paul identifies some patterns of humility that should be practiced as we come together to participate in the Lord's Supper, what are those patterns, and what are the consequences of not practicing them? <p><u>Questions towards Spiritual Growth & Discipleship:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge you to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are you motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating you apply some of the principles from this passage to your family, career, community, or church? 4. How might Jesus be using you to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
