

Questions for Reflection & Discussion:	
1. Jethro plays an important role in the development of Moses as a leader to the people of Israel. Jethro assesses the patterns of Moses' leadership habits and makes wise recommendations regarding how he can be a more effective leader to the people. In this way, Jethro is a mentor. Discuss the role that mentors have played in your spiritual formation. Who were they? What wisdom did they provide that aided you in your journey?	
2. Part of Jethro's advice is to point out the inadequacy and insufficiency of Moses to meet the needs and demands of the people. He is concerned that both Moses and people will burn out. Discuss the importance of a leader relying on others to help them carry out the various tasks associated with their leadership position. How does recognition and admission of our own inabilities help us to form as	Prayer Requests Family
humble and effective spiritual leaders?  3. In chapter 19, one of God's first acts in forming his nation is to make a covenant with them and provide them with a law. As God's covenant people, he declares that he will relate with and to the nation in 3 distinct ways. What are those ways? (19:1-6) How do they correlate with the Church today?	Church
4. As a covenant partner God asks the people to respond in two distinct ways, they are listed at the beginning of verse 5. What would it look like to obey God's voice in both an immediate and continual sense?  And how would Israel both succeed and fail in their faithfulness as God's covenant partner?	Community
