3. Talk about the wisest people you have known if your life, what made them wise? What were the characteristics of their life and leadership that most influenced you? How did wisdom work itself out in their life?	
4. Paul says that we (the Church) have been given everything in Christ. (vss. 21-23). What observations might a person make about the Church if we truly lived as if all things were ours?	Prayer Requests Family
5. Discuss the good gifts that have been given to you by God. How might these gifts be nurtured, employed, trained, utilized, developed, or discipled for the glory of God?	Church
