Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><b>Read the Text</b> -read the text together. (1 Cor. 10:1-13)</p> <p><b>Discussion Guiding Questions:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Explore verses 1-5 together. What similarities is Paul shedding light on between the Hebrew people of the Exodus, and the people of God in Corinth?</li> <li>2. In verses 6 &amp; 11 Paul gives descriptions regarding how the Church might perceive accounts in the Old Testament. Why were these accounts recorded for the Church?</li> <li>3. What are the evil desires that Paul addresses in verses 7-12?</li> <li>4. How do these evil desires still manifest themselves in the Church today? Are we still guilty of them? If so, how?</li> <li>5. Temptation towards these desires is still powerful, yet God is faithful. What are some ways, or Who is the way, that God has provided for our escape? And why does this give us hope to endure?</li> </ol> <p><b>Questions towards Spiritual Growth &amp; Discipleship:</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. How does this text challenge you to grow in a greater love for God?</li> <li>2. How are you motivated to grow in a greater love for others?</li> <li>3.
