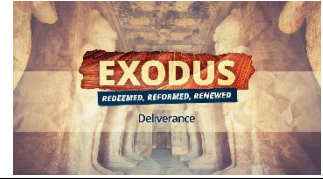

<p>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with Prayer -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>Read the Text</u> -Exodus 11-12 (or portions of it).</p> <p><u>Questions for Reflection & Discussion:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. When confronted with portions of scripture that are difficult as it relates to our overall understanding of God, what are some helpful tips or reminders that you hold on to? Why is important for us to take God at his word, and be willing to live within the tensions of our faith? How does this demonstrate a “walking by faith” posture? And, what might this humility communicate to those who have not yet believed about our overall confidence in God’? 2. Compare and contrast the 10th plague with the death of Jesus, the firstborn of all creation. In what ways does this event pull our imaginations toward Jesus’ sacrificial death? In what ways is it different? 3. Where are we able to see images of God’s mercy even within this devastating and traumatic event? In his wrath, how is God remembering mercy? 4. In what ways does God prepare and make provisions for his people in the wilderness? 5. How does God make a way for all peoples, regardless of national ethnicity, to participate in the Passover feast? How does the inclusion of gentiles, give us a glimpse of God’s broader salvation purposes? What qualities of God are displayed in this act? And, what qualities is he impressing upon his people? <p><u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation & Application:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are we motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating us to apply some of the principles from this passage to our families, careers, communities, or churches? 4. How might Jesus be using us to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
