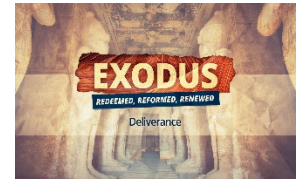

<p><b>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</b></p> <p>Start with <b>Prayer</b> -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><b><u>Read the Text</u></b> -Exodus 13-14 (or portions of it).</p> <p><b><u>Questions for Reflection &amp; Discussion:</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. In chapter 13:1-2, the Lord asks Moses to consecrate, set apart, or make holy the firstborn of Israel. As you continue to read the rest of the chapter, what does this consecration look like? How does holiness work? What does it mean for God to set apart a people unto himself?</li> <li>2. How have we traditionally understood and practiced holiness? Could holiness be less about what we do, or don't do, and more about participating in the life and mission that God has called us into? How might growing in love and growing in holiness often parallel one another?</li> <li>3. In 13:17-22, we can make many observations regarding how God leads his people. As you read this text together, note some takeaways regarding God's leading. How might we identify a people group who are being formed and led by God?</li> <li>4. Chapter 14 opens up with the Hebrew people between a rock and a hard place. How does Moses, as the leader of the people, redirect their eyes from their enemies (10-12) to their Savior (13-14)? What response does Moses encourage from the people (end of verse 14)? Why is this response hard for us when faced with obstacles and adversities in our own lives?</li> <li>5. How does God's victory motivate and inspire you to live and move with purpose in the world today?</li> </ol> <p><b><u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation &amp; Application:</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. How does this text challenge us to grow in a greater love for God?</li> <li>2. How are we motivated to grow in a greater love for others?</li> <li>3. How might Jesus be motivating us to apply some of the principles from this passage to our families, careers, communities, or churches?</li> <li>4. How might Jesus be using us to draw those that do not know him, unto himself?</li> <li>5.
