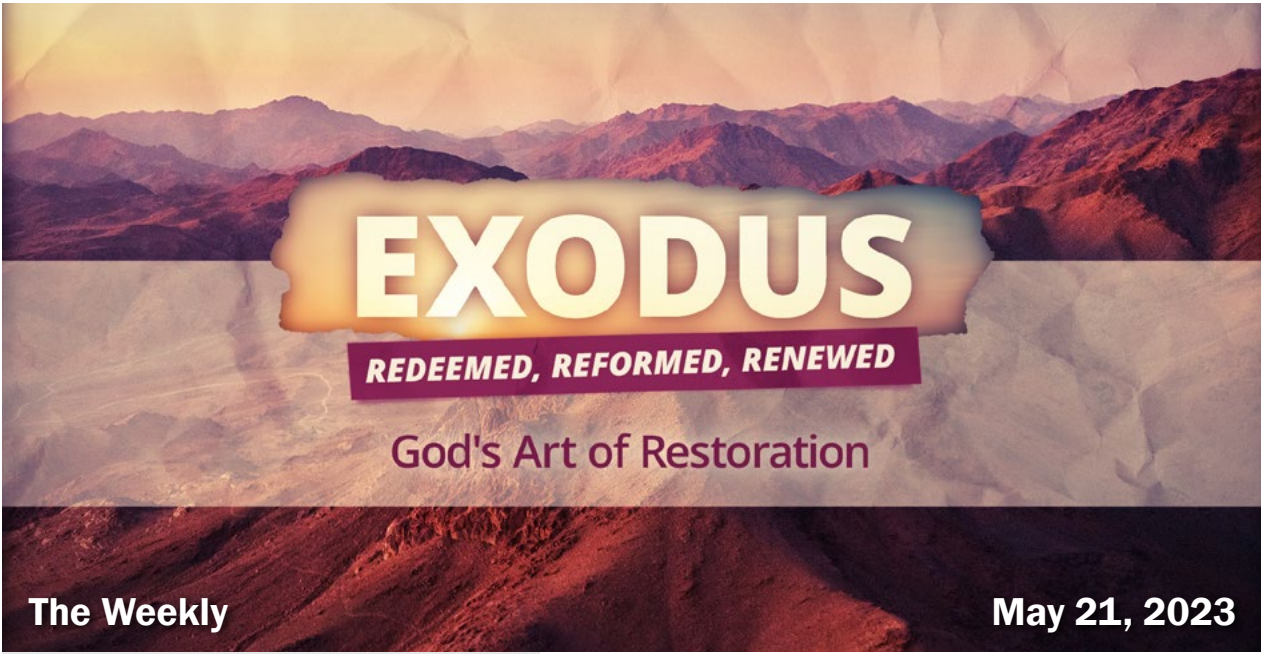

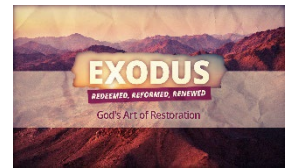

<p>Get together as a family or with a friend or group of friends this week!</p> <p>Start with Prayer -ask Jesus to guide our time together. Go over prayer requests together.</p> <p><u>Read the Text</u> -Exodus 35-39 (whole or part)</p> <p><u>Questions for Reflection & Discussion:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Spend time reading and reflecting on how Paul's iterations in 4:11-16 correlate to the spirit of what is taking place in Exodus 35-39. What are the commonalities between these Old & New Testament passages? 2. Exodus 35:20-22 reflects an image of fruitful participation in the work that God was doing then. What in this passage might inform our fruitful participation in the work that God is doing today? 3. The tabernacle was a costly endeavor for the Israelite nation. As the project concluded, there was an accounting, much like the one that would later take place with the people in the book of Numbers. What does, "counting the cost" communicate to disciples following Jesus in the world today? (Lk. 14:27-33) 4. What did the clothing of the priests communicate to the people of Israel? (Ex. 39:30) Why was it important for both the priests and the people to regularly be reminded of this designation? (Lev. 19:2; 1 Pet. 1:13-17) 5. Upon inspection of the work that was done, Moses sees that it is good, and right, and then blesses the people. How does this event take us back into the creation narrative (Gen.1:28,31)? What has God recreated in the establishment of the Tabernacle? Why was this important to the nation, Israel? What is Jesus building today, why is it important for us? <p><u>Questions guiding Spiritual Formation & Application:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How does this text challenge us to grow in a greater love for God? 2. How are we motivated to grow in a greater love for others? 3. How might Jesus be motivating us to apply some of the principles from this passage to our families, careers, communities, or churches? 4. How might Jesus be using us to draw those that do not know him, unto himself? 5.
