SPN Parish Council Holy Moment Thought... "THE FIRE OF JESUS' LOVE"

"Jesus said..." I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished! Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother, a mother-in-law against her daughter-in-law and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law." (Ref Luke 12: 49 - 51).

Some people think that words spoken by Jesus from Luke 12: 49 - 51 are a hyperbole, that is, a great exaggeration. Do you think so? Then, please look at a Crucifix. Is Jesus nailed to the Cross wearing a crown of thorns a hyperbole? Of course not!

Jesus proclaimed that he wished the earth were already ablaze with His love. Jesus said in another passage that the purpose of His life is to proclaim the truth. If you belong to the truth, you will listen to His voice. He further said. If you do not belong to the truth, you will oppose Him.

Falsehood always opposes the truth. Here are a few examples within the Bible...Cain murdered Abel; Esau hated his brother Jacob and would have killed him if he had the opportunity; The brothers of Joseph sold him into slavery; Judas, an intimate companion of Jesus betrayed Him for 30 pieces of silver.
