SCRIPTURE READING

Luke 14:25-33

14:25 Now large crowds were traveling with him, and he turned and said to them, 14:26

"Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers

and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple. 14:27 Whoever does not carry

the cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. 14:28 For which of you, intending to build a

tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to

complete it? 14:29 Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all

who see it will begin to ridicule him, 14:30 saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not

able to finish.' 14:31 Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit

down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes

against him with twenty thousand? 14:32 If he cannot, then while the other is still far away,

he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. 14:33 So therefore, none of you can

become my disciple if you do not give up all your possessions.

The Cost and Joy of Discipleship (Luke 14:1, 7–14)

In Luke 14:25–33, Jesus confronts the crowd with the uncompromising demand of

discipleship. To follow Him is not an addition to life, but the surrender of life itself. The call

to "hate" father, mother, and even one's own life is not a summons to contempt for others,

but a radical reordering of love: Christ before all. For Pastor and Theologian Dietrich

Bonhoeffer, this is the sharp edge of costly grace. Grace does not leave us as we are; it seizes

us, tears us from our securities, and binds us wholly to the Lord who goes to the cross.

Jesus warns against beginning what one cannot finish, as if discipleship were a matter of

calculation. Yet the true reckoning is this: to cling to possessions, relationships, and self-will

is to forfeit Him; to renounce all is to gain Him. As Bonhoeffer writes, "When Christ calls a

man, he bids him come and die."

— Dietrich Bonhoeffer, The Cost of Discipleship (1937)

Thus, the hard word of Luke 14 is in truth the word of freedom. To lose everything for

Christ is to discover that He is sufficient. The disciple's life is not his own project, but

Christ's work in him. The cross stands before us—not as an option, but as the only way.
