Final pre-worship hymn sing this Sunday


This Sunday, Paul Colthorpe and members of the choir will lead a mini-hymn sing before the service starts so arrive a bit early and fill your heart with song!

As one of three commissioners of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, Marie Wilson criss-crossed Canada for six years, documenting the history and lasting impacts of the Canadian Indian residential school system. She has recently written a book, *North of Nowhere*, and will be speaking at Comox United following worship on Sunday, September 21, from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm. There will also be time afterward for conversation around the book sales table.

Small Group Profile: United Church Women (UCW)

The latest in a series of profiles of small groups at Comox United. This week, it's the United Church Women (UCW).

The UCW was created in 1963 as a unique national organization with a mission to love God; foster Christian commitment, faithfulness, and spirituality; and promote respect and love for all God's creation. Today there are UCW units in almost every United Church across Canada.

Here at Comox United, the Lousia Catchpole Unit meets eight times during the year (September to November, and January to May.) There are no meetings in July or August, and in June and December we have luncheons to

which ladies of the congregation are invited. These are always happy occasions at which we collect donations of toiletries to be given to women in Transition House and Stepping Stones.

We raise funds by serving teas after funeral and memorial services, and by organizing bake sales/bazaars in May and November. Thanks go to the congregation for their support of those events. The money we raise is disbursed in November after discussion at the monthly meeting. We donate to charities and organizations locally, nationally and internationally. Occasionally, in the event of a national catastrophe, fire or flood for example, a donation will be sent at other times of the year to the Red Cross to help with recovery efforts. A list of the organizations we support can be seen on the UCW notice board in the church hall.

We are always happy to welcome new members. Meetings are a mix of business and social gathering over tea and goodies, and are not an ordeal. Why not join us?


"Queerly Beloved" starts at Weird Church on Mon Sept 8

The 444 Project

4 People x \$4 x 4 times

Jesus said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them."

- Matthew 18:20

Our church is much more than a building, it is a community of faith: people who have been brought together by a common love for God and a desire to live out acts of faith, hope, peace and love. During this time of political uncertainty, sovereignty threats, wars, rising prices and environmental challenges, coming together to enjoy companionship and simple shared pleasures bring us comfort, support, escape, and joy. This challenging environment makes now the perfect time to begin the **444 Project**.

A combination of community building and fundraising for our church, the **444 Project** invites us to reach out to friends and invite them (in groups of **4**) to join us in a shared interest while asking them to contribute **\$4**. For example, when we **invite 4** friends over for dinner, a hike in the woods, a games night, a concert at Simms Park, etc.

"I'm holding a coffee and dessert night as a fundraiser for my church where participants are asked to donate \$4. Will you come?"

When each of the 4 invited people contribute \$4 to the gathering, \$16 is raised. When we do this 4 times over the next year raising \$16 over 4 occasions, that equals \$64. We then donate the money we have raised back to the church as a 444 Project charitable donation. If 75 congregation members participate and host 4 x 444 Project events over the next twelve months, we will raise \$4800 to help the church with its work, with the added bonus that 75 (and possibly more) members will have had the opportunity to connect more deeply through fun and enjoyment with 16 other church members, family and friends.

While not everyone has space to host dinners, we can reach out and invite 4 friends to join us

- at the marina to share a thermos of tea
- for a walk in the forest
- for whale and sea lion watching at Point Holmes
- to play cards
- to meet to discuss a book in a park.

The **444 Project** represents simple pleasures that provide us with enjoyable opportunities for discussion and fellowship. And if meeting with **4** people at a time seems too much, we can invite 2 people over 8 times over the year.

Along the way, we hope to share some photos of our group gatherings in our Grapevine newsletter.

Frequently Asked Questions

What does the 444 in the title of the project stand for?

4 People x \$4 x 4 times. Invite 4 people to join you in an enjoyable activity explaining it is part of a fundraising campaign for the church. Ask each of them to contribute \$4 to the activity, and do this four times over the year. $4 \times 4 = 64$ raised and donated to the church. If 75 people participate, \$4800 will be raised.

What will the money be used for?

Our church council is still discussing what the project's earnings will be used for. You will be updated when that decision has been made.

Will the money I donate be considered a charitable donation for tax purposes?

Yes.

It's hard to ask people for money.

It can be. But if someone asked you over for dinner and explained about their church fundraiser, would you have a problem giving them two toonies for an enjoyable activity with friends? By asking for such a small amount it's easy. We make money for the church by the multiplication of \$4 but we also benefit from socializing.

Are we inviting church members or other people?

We hope that there will be increased socialization among our own congregation members because that helps our church community grow stronger. However, this is also a great opportunity to once again talk about something fun our church is doing to people outside of our church which increases our visibility and awareness. You choose whatever works for you.

Does it have to be 4 people?

Invite the number of people you are comfortable with. If for your own reasons you want to only invite 2 people to join you that's great. If you want to have a backyard BBQ for 20 people that's fantastic! Do what you are comfortable with. Remember you have until next May so you can spread out your invitations.

Do I have to do something with the money I collect?

Please put it in an envelope with your name, address and 444 Project on the outside of the envelope. Give the envelope to the 444 Project Coordinator Elaine Brown who will look after the banking of it, sending you a copy of the deposit slip, and ensure that the information is provided to our Givings Administrator for tax receipt purposes.
