
## **CATRA Work Days**

#### "The Plan: How to Hear from God" Series: Pathway of Prayer Rev. Randall G. Bennett, Jr.

**Scripture Focus:** "Our Father, who art in heaven..." (Matthew 6:9a)

Background: The Gospel of Matthew was written for a Jewish audience to demonstrate that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Jesus is portrayed as the divine Son and perfect image of God the Father throughout the Gospel. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus centers His teaching on righteousness not as public performance, but as an authentic relationship with God. Prayer, along with fasting and almsgiving, formed one of the core expressions of Jewish piety. Jesus redefines these practices as the fruit of an authentic relationship with God. When Jesus taught the Lord's Prayer, He offered not only words to recite, but a transformative way of relating to God: intimately, confidently, and with childlike trust. It is a prayer both personal and corporate: we address God not as "my Father" but "our Father," reminding us that life with God is always life shared in community.

<u>Sermon Idea:</u> The Pathway of Prayer begins with *The Plan*: trusting Our Father and listening for His voice. "*Our Father, who art in heaven,*" is God's invitation into a grace-filled relationship, reminding us that He hears us as a loving parent. Martin Luther reflected that, "*God is a good and loving parent—eager to listen, compassionate, generous.*" John Wesley agreed that calling God, "*our Father,*" echoes Romans 8:15, where "we cry, Abba, Father." Prayer, for Wesley, was a means of grace given by God, through which the Holy Spirit renovates and transforms our souls. The words, "in heaven," remind us that God the Father is immanent and transcendent, reigning in both mercy and majesty. This first phrase of the Lord's Prayer is not only an invitation to speak, but a promise that God listens, leads, and loves.

This Week's Practice: Begin each day with two minutes of silence. Slowly pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven." Let God speak next and write what you hear in a listening journal.
