Catholic Theology

4th century-11th century

Development of Creeds/Catechisms against false teaching

"Great Schism" - separated Eastern Orthodox / R.C.C.

Protestant Theology

11th century-16th century

"Reformation" - separated Protestants / R.C.C.

4 movements: Lutheran, Anglican, Reformed, Anabaptist

Puritan / Calvinistic Theology

16th century-17th century

Reformation movement from the Church of England

Baptist Theology

17th century-21st century

Separatist movement from Church of England reformation
