When Disobeying Your Mission Sinks You Jonah 2

I. FALSE BELIEFS ABOUT GOD'S CALL

A. God won't ask you to do something you **DON'T** want to do.

Isaiah 55:8 says:

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD.

B. I'm not worthy nor <u>CAPABLE</u> to do God's work. Romans 3:23 Says:

For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

"God doesn't call the qualified, He qualifies the called" (David Jeremiah).

- C. I've said no to God so He will NEVER ask me again.
 - 1. Aren't you glad that we serve a God of second chances?
 - 2. Like Jonah, we have three ways we can live our lives.
 - a. My way
 - b. Your way
 - c. God's way
 - 3. The only way for a Christian to live is God's way.

II. THREE PRAYERS OF JONAH FROM THE FISH'S BELLY

A. Prayer of rescue. Jonah 2:2 And said, I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the Lord, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

- B. Prayer of **RESTORATION** (Jonah 2:3-6)
- C. Prayer of rededication- Jonah 2:9 says: But I will sacrifice unto thee with the voice of thanksgiving; I will pay that that I have vowed. Salvation is of the LORD.

III. WHY DID JONAH RUN FROM GOD'S MISSIONS?

A. Maybe out of fear (2 Tim. 1:7)

Fear is letting your circumstances come between you and God.

Faith is letting God get between you and your circumstances.

- B. Maybe he had too much pride.
- C. Perhaps it was insecurity
- D. Most likely it was **PREJUDICY**.
 - 1. Assyria was Israel's enemy
 - 2. Jonah would rather side with his culture than side with God.
 - 3. When nationalism is more important than God, we are in big trouble.
