WELCOME TO ST. JOHN'S LUTHERAN CHURCH!

Founded by German immigrants in 1745, St. John's Lutheran Church is one of the oldest congregations in the North Carolina Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We are part of a rich heritage that now spans 184 congregations and 45,000 Lutherans in North Carolina, nearly 3 million ELCA members across 65 synods in the United States, and a global communion of 78 million Lutherans through the Lutheran World Federation.

From a humble meetinghouse in 1745 to our place in the global body of Christ, St. John's continues to share God's love far beyond our own walls, living into the promise of the communion of saints.

THIS SUNDAY AT ST. JOHN'S

* Today is Holy Cross Day, officially the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This Christian feast is always celebrated on September 14th in Catholic, Orthodox, and Anglican traditions. It commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by Saint Helena in 326 AD, the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in 335 AD, and the return of the True Cross to Jerusalem by Emperor Heraclius in 629 AD. The feast honors Christ's sacrifice on the cross, transforming it from a symbol of torture into a sign of hope and salvation for believers.

SERVICE NOTES

- ❖ A printed cross ♣ is an invitation to make the sign of the cross on your forehead or body. We make the sign of the cross to remember our Baptism and the promise: "You have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever."
- **Bold print** indicates a speaking part for the whole assembly.
- * Restrooms are located in the Narthex to the right of the front door and through the doors behind the choir to the left.
- ❖ A nursery is available for your use. Ask an usher for directions.

A NOTE FROM PASTOR MATT HANSEN

People of St. John's:

This weekend, the church observes Holy Cross Day, a festival that centers us on what's most important. The cross is not just a nice shiny brass fixture on our altar. The cross is the sign of God's deep love for the world, the place where Christ bore the weight of sin and suffering, and the place where death did not mark the end.



On September 14, 335, Christians gathered to dedicate the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, a church built on what was believed to be the site of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. Ever since, the day has been set aside to "lift high the cross," not as an object of sorrow alone, but as a sign of God's power to bring life from death.

We mark Holy Cross Day not to glorify suffering, but to confess that God meets us in our weakness and transforms it. The cross reminds us that the places in life that feel like endings are not the final word. In Christ, God takes those very places and opens them to resurrection hope.

Each time we make the sign of the cross in Holy Baptism, in worship, or even in prayer at home, we are reminded that we belong to Christ forever. Marked with the cross of Christ, we live in hope, strengthened to bear one another's burdens and to share God's love with the world.

This is why this festival day is so important.



FIRST READING: NUMBERS 21:4b-9

A reading from Numbers.

[From Mount Horeb the Israelites set out,] ^{4b} but the people became discouraged on the way. ⁵ The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." ⁶ Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. ⁷ The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. ⁸ And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." ⁹ So Moses made a serpent of bronze and put it upon a pole, and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

⁴Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.


SECOND READING: 1 CORINTHIANS 1:18-24

A reading from 1 Corinthians.

¹⁸ The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." ²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scholar? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of the proclamation, to save those who believe. ²² For Jews ask for signs and Greeks desire wisdom, ²³ but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God.


GOSPEL: JOHN 3:13-17



POST COMMUNION PRAYER


