## **Sunday School Teacher Needed**


We continue to need one more Sunday School teacher. All classes are team taught, so no one teaches every week. Please volunteer. For more information, please contact Pastor Stacy.

The congregation will present Bibles to six grade students during worship on October 26.


# Revised Discipleship Trait Posters


## **Memory Bible Verses**

- I have memorized this Bible passage.

As they complete the challenges for each passage, students can meet with a pastor to share their accomplishment and earn a

#### CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING August 19, 2025

Treasurer's Report–Given by Louie: There were a couple of coding issues in the report that need to be corrected. July giving was down but still ahead of budget. This is typical of summer months.

#### **New Business:**

Focus for 2025—Who are we as First Congregational? - Chris

Chris' recommendation: Key Words: connection, service, inclusive, generous, learning/growing:

Love God and serve people. Everyone is welcome because everyone matters.

Marie recommended using it in the bulletin for a few weeks to test drive the response from the congregation. Chris will have some graphic design work done on it.

Tuck Pointing and Bell Tower—Louie: The cost is expensive. There is a small amount in a fund to start saving towards the cost. Some of the sheet metal needs to be replaced. Tim has requested 2 bids—1 bid is back so far on the cost of the bell tower project—under review by Trustees at this time. Base bid on repairs is almost \$200,000. No issues structurally but decisions will need to be made regarding the creation of a fund. Information will be ready for presentation and discussion at the annual meeting.

Endowment Gift Next Steps—A gift from Jan Hansen estate of \$250,000. Currently invested in a CD. Intention of the family was to have the funds help the church in some manner. Decisions need to be made regarding how the funds should be used.

New Committee Members: Christian Ed, Mission Ed still need committee members.

Minister for Community Update—Marie—no update at this time.

Endowment Loan Study Group—Marie and Louie—group on hold due to Jan Hansen endowment gift. They meet again on September 16th to discuss what the available options are. There is \$82,000 left in the Capital Campaign account to determine use. Current investments are doing well.

Church Insurance Update of Coverage and Deductibles—Louie and Chris—handout provided. Current coverage is through the company: Insurance Board. Premium is lower. Deductibles are changed. Grateful to have insurance coverage at all.


### **River Falls Food Pantry**
