COMMUNITY LIFE

For our Season of Creation this year, we are joining congregations across Canada in CLWR's Friends of Creation campaign. Throughout September, we'll reflect on God's call to steward the earth by looking at how climate intersects with food, water, peace, and local economies around Lake Chad, at the frontlines of climate change. Together, we'll reflect, pray, and have a chance to take action to help restore land and livelihoods in one of the world's most vulnerable regions.

With matching grants, every \$50 raised can restore 1 acre of land around Lake Chad. Our Good Shepherd goal to restore 50 acres of land around Lake Chad, so our target is to raise \$2500 before the end of the year. Every dollar helps! INTRODUCTION

In Genesis 2 we read, "The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." In the beginning, God placed humankind in a garden—not just to eat from it, but to tend it with care. To till it, yes—but also to keep it. The land was given as a gift, and with it, a calling: to be stewards of the earth and of one another.

One of the gardens of God's creation is the Lake Chad region, in Central and West Africa. Once full of fish, farmland, and fruit-bearing trees, this area has long sustained families who rely on farming, fishing, and livestock to survive. But today, the land is struggling.

On this second Sunday in the Season of Creation, we join with churches across Canada in lifting up **food** in our CLWR Friends of Creation campaign. We know in our own agricultural region how important healthy land, fresh water, and good weather are to the farms and ranches that produce food.

Around Lake Chad in Central Africa, farming depends totally on rainfall. Shorter growing seasons and unreliable rainfall are making it harder for farmers to grow enough food, and malnutrition is a growing concern, especially among children. CLWR's work around Lake Chad tackles food security at all levels to restore the resilience of the land and the people.

We take a moment to center our hearts and minds on the God who created the earth and all that dwell within it.

These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.



The holy gospel according to Matthew.


Glory to you, O Lord.
