Matthew 13:24-30 & 36-43

- 1) The King's Kingdom Faces Opposition Be Realistic (verses 24-30, 36-39)
 - Same field, rival sowers
 - Evil endures by God's design
- 2) The King's Judgment Will Come Be Patient and Confident (verses 30, 40-42)
 - Delay is not defeat
 - Justice will be perfect
- 3) The King's People Will Shine Be Hopeful (verse 43)
 - Belong to Jesus now
 - Shine with Him forever
