The parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin.

By this time a lot of men and women of questionable reputation were hanging around Jesus, listening intently. The Pharisees and religion scholars were not pleased, not at all pleased. They growled, "He takes in sinners and eats meals with them, treating them like old friends."

Their grumbling triggered this story. "Suppose one of you had a hundred sheep and lost one. Wouldn't you leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the lost one until you found it? When found, you can be sure you would put it across your shoulders, rejoicing, and when you got home call in your friends and neighbors, saying, 'Celebrate with me! I've found

my lost sheep!' Count on it—there's more joy in heaven over one sinner's rescued life than over ninety-nine good people in no need of rescue. "Or imagine a woman who has ten coins and loses one. Won't she light a lamp and scour the house, looking in every nook and cranny until she finds it? And when she finds it you can be sure she'll call her friends and neighbors: 'Celebrate with me! I found my lost coin!' Count on it—that's the kind of party God's angels throw every time one lost soul turns to God."

Remembering

Reader 1:

I remember the time of creation, of choosing colour and texture, mountain height and valley depth. I remember how God sculpted love into it all – every nook and cranny alive with the promise of heaven. And we give thanks for it all: its richest splendour and darkest secret.

Reader 2:

I remember the parting of the waters, the choice of Moses to follow God into the wilderness, the elements against them but the promise before them – choosing to go where God led: into a future where water flowed from rock and manna waited in the morning. And we give thanks for it all: the story of Exodus, of the Red Sea and the land of milk and honey.

Reader 3:

I remember the prophet Joel's voice calling the people of Israel to choose a new way of living: to care for the widow and the orphan and to know what would happen if they carried on as they were. And we give thanks for it all: the choice to hear God's longing for a new world, and to change and follow it.

Reader 4:

I remember John the Baptist, who lived in the wilds and spoke of a new heaven and earth, and shouted at the world to choose a new way of living that recognised justice; who took water and blessed its use. And we give thanks for it all: being newborn into a world renewed by our right living.

Reader 5:

I remember Jesus Christ, who upset the tables in the temple. And who later took bread and wine, the simplest of food, and blessed and broke it and shared it with people like us. This bread and wine speak of our choice to follow Jesus into a world renewed by love, where all creation rejoices in God.

Leader: Come and choose to eat and drink and belong to this new community: a way of living that will not let go of the world: a way of loving that is willing to make the difficult choices, loving enough to stick by all that is broken and bring it to new birth. Jesus said, 'Come, follow me. Come eat and drink, and know I go before you.'

Words of Institution

We do what Jesus did the night before he died. He took bread, gave thanks, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends, and said, "Take, eat; remember me."

Then he took the cup, and said, "Take, drink; remember."
