## THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS ~ SEPTEMBER 14, 2025

**READINGS:** Nm 21: 4B-9; Phil 2: 6-11; Jn 3:13-17

One of the aspects of our stewardship should be a desire to understand and appreciate the significance of many of the celebrations, feasts, and solemnities we as Catholics observe and experience. Today's Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross celebrates three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by St. Helena; the construction and dedication of churches by Helena's son the Emperor Constantine on the site of Mt. Calvary where Christ was crucified; and the return of the Cross to Jerusalem by the Emperor Heraclius II.

As Catholics, we need to remember the Cross every time we make the Sign of the Cross. We make that sign often and almost always at the beginning and the end of our prayers. However, that sign in itself is a prayer. Sometimes we do it automatically without really considering its meaning and importance. Rather than a hurried sign, we should make the Sign of the Cross with reverence, respect, and the constant reflection of how vital the Cross is to our salvation. Stewardship invites us to practice our faith with this deference and appreciation to the Lord, truly in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.






Drop off items at the church office or school office on Thursday, October 16 or Friday, October 17.



#### Upcoming Processes/Action Cycle of Topeka Jump Justice Work:

- 1). <u>Listening Process</u> (August October) Grassroot *Listening Sessions* are held The opportunity for the community to voice its concerns, followed by the *Community Problems Assembly* When all gather to narrow down and identify the issue(s) voiced in the listening sessions to be work on in the upcoming year
- 2). **Research to Action** (November May) **Research** on issues is done, and working solutions are proposed, followed by the **Nehemiah Action** when all gather to bring forth to community leaders the solutions or actions that can address the problems in the community

#### **JUMP FAQs**

#### How is JUMP organized?

Each parish is a network of Topeka JUMP. The network's goal is to turn out its average weekly mass attendance (at MPHM 1,600) to JUMPs annual assembly (Nehemiah Action) each year. Large numbers of people at the assembly show city and county leaders community support for changes and improvements the JUMP is working toward.

#### • Great. But really, what does MPHM JUMP ask of each parishioner?

To prayerfully get involved in one of 3 ways.

1. Bring your family, to our Nehemiah Action, April/May 2026

#### 2. Become a MPHM Network Member.

Basic requirements:

Bring 3+ people with you to the Nehemiah Action

Attend 5 other sessions (see year schedule above) to keep you informed about JUMPs work

After watching JUMPs process, prayerfully consider a financial investment.

#### 2. Become a Team Leader

Keep 10 Network Members informed and plugged into MPHM's network.

#### What are some community problem areas JUMP has tackled?

Affordable Housing, Mental Health, Gun Violence, Predatory Lending

#### How are these problem areas identified?

Problems are surfaced at Listening Sessions. Network Members vote on new issues.

#### Who runs JUMP?

Network Members and clergy make up JUMPs Board of Directors, decide on issue work, conduct research into problems and solutions, and bring their congregations to our Nehemiah Assembly.

#### Beyond justice, what are some other fruits of JUMP membership?

Participation in JUMP strengthens relationships in both the parish and the community. JUMPs Network Members share that JUMP's unitive nature is a blessing, in an age where division in the public arena grows daily.
