As the **Theology of Place** is based upon **A Song Of Faith**, excerpts from **A Song Of Faith** will also be printed in the Bulletin each week. This is the most recent Statement of Faith created for the United Church of Canada. It was adopted in 2006, but was being created for several years prior to that. What do we believe? As individuals and as a congregation? How do those beliefs impact our ministry in the community? These are important questions to ask ourselves at any time, but particularly as we plan for the future.

Did you know that you could build a home in your back garden for a family member or a friend to live in? Apparently, this is true. A Program called **Home Suite Hope** has been promoting this concept for a number of years. Now, with affordable housing difficult to find for many people, the organization is encouraging homeowners to build a 800 square foot home on their property which could be rented to suitable clients. The rent would be affordable for the occupant, geared to their income and subsidized by **Home Suite Hope**, while providing rental income to the homeowner. There will be a meeting at Port Nelson United Church at 7 p.m. on September 23rd, if you are interested in learning more about this program.

The annual **Walk To the Lighthouse 2025** will be held on Sunday, September 21st. You are encouraged to walk in support of Mental Heath Programs offered at Joseph Brant Hospital.
