

Matthew 5:3


Matthew 4:23 tells us that Jesus was "teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and curing

every disease and every sickness among the people," just prior to beginning of The Sermon on the Mount.

Matthew 9:35, repeats that same phrase, "teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness," following chapters 8 and 9 which give a glimpse into Jesus' healing ministry.

The repetition of this phrase is not lazy writing. These identical phrases serve as bookends to help us, the readers, understand the chapters in between, which declare loudly that God's coming kingdom will have no brokenness, oppression, sadness, or loss. Chapter 5 opens the Sermon on the Mount with the Beatitudes – lessons on moral and ethical living in which we begin to understand about the Kingdom of God. In this second Sunday of our Fall Worship Series, we will roll back to the first beatitude, "blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Blessing those who are poor in spirit as they come before God with open arms and an understanding of their dependence on God; for they are given the abundant kingdom of God. So, to everyone who recognizes their great need, Jesus declares God's overwhelming provisions both here and in eternity.

I look forward to worshiping with you this Sunday as we dig deeper into our understanding of righteousness and grace as we open our arms to receiving the Spirit of God to help direct us in this beautiful life and bring about the kingdom of God. $J\mathcal{U}$


