Righteous Speech in Proverbs

I. Introduction

Winston Churchill's "We Shall Fight on the Beaches" speech, given on June 4, 1940, is one of the greatest motivational speeches ever. It was a scary time—World War II was raging, France was losing, and Britain was next in line for a Nazi invasion. Churchill's words turned fear into courage, making people ready to stand strong.

His speech was powerful because he used simple but strong words that stuck with everyone. He repeated, "We shall fight on the beaches, we shall fight on the landing grounds, we shall fight in the streets." This made people feel like they could fight anywhere, no matter what. His deep, serious voice made the words hit hard, and he didn't hide the truth—he said things looked bad but promised Britain would never give up.

Although Churchill spoke to leaders in Parliament, his words reached all British people through the radio. He motivated them to stay tough, join the fight, and keep going even when bombs fell, or food was short. He made them believe they could protect their home and freedom, no matter how hard it got.

II. Motivation for Righteous Speech

Righteous Speech is Valuable

Proverbs 10:20 - The tongue of the righteous is choice silver; the heart of the wicked is of little worth.

Proverbs 25:11 - A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver.

Proverbs 25:12 - Like a gold ring or an ornament of gold is a wise reprover to a listening ear.

Proverbs 19:1 - Better is a poor person who walks in his integrity than one who is crooked in speech and is a fool.


3. What is this proverb teaching us about the value of righteous speech?

Righteous Speech is Nourishing

Righteous Speech is Restoring

Proverbs 12:18 - There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Proverbs 12:25 - Anxiety in a man's heart weighs him down, but a good word makes him glad.

Proverbs 15:4 - A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit.

- Proverbs 12:19 Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue is but for a moment.
- Proverbs 13:5 The righteous hates falsehood, but the wicked brings shame and disgrace.

Righteous Speech is Encouraging

Proverbs 15:23 - To make an apt answer is a joy to a man, and a word in season, how good it is!

Proverbs 25:13 - Like the cold of snow in the time of harvest is a faithful messenger to those who send him; he refreshes the soul of his masters.

Righteous Speech is Influential

Proverbs 16:13 - Righteous lips are the delight of a king, and he loves him who speaks what is right.

Proverbs 25:15 - With patience a ruler may be persuaded, and a soft tongue will break a bone.

Proverbs 16:21 - The wise of heart is called discerning, and sweetness of speech increases persuasiveness.

Proverbs 18:23 - The poor use entreaties, but the rich answer roughly.
