

## WE HEAR THE WORD OF GOD

**First Reading** 

Exodus 32:7-14

The Lord said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!' "The Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them, and of you I will make a great nation."

But Moses implored the Lord his God and said, "O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham, Isaac, and Israel, your servants, how you swore to them by your own self, saying to them, 'I will multiply your descendants like the stars of heaven, and all this land that I have promised I will give to your descendants, and they shall inherit it forever.'" And the Lord changed his mind about the disaster that he planned to bring on his people.

Reader: Word of God. Word of Life.

All: Thanks be to God.

Psalm Psalm 51:1-10

Reader: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; in your great compassion blot out my

offenses. Wash me through and through from my wickedness, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know

my offenses, and my sin is ever before me.

High: Against you only have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are justified when you speak and right in your judgment. Indeed, I was born steeped in wickedness, a sinner from my mother's womb. Indeed, you delight in truth deep within me, and would have me know wisdom deep within.

Low: Remove my sins with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be purer than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; that the body you have broken may rejoice. Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my wickedness.

All: Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

## **Second Reading**

1 Timothy 1:12-17

I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he considered me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience as an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.

Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

## Welcome and Commitment to Deeper Learning

Pastor: Dear friends, we gather today with these young people who have been called by God's Spirit to study more deeply the Christian faith and life into which they were baptized. Together, let us bless them for

this new stage of their journey of faith in Jesus Christ.

All: Amen.

A sponsor (perhaps a parent, baptismal sponsor, prayer partner, or other congregation member) presents each person.

Sponsor: I present <u>NAME</u> to be blessed by this congregation.

A reading from Psalm 119, "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."

Pastor: Grace and mercy are given to all who call upon God's name. We pray that God may bring you

into deeper faith through your learning and growing during this year of confirmation classes. Will you commit to being curious, diligent, and faithful in your study of God's word and how

it applies to our lives throughout this year?

Students respond: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Pastor: People of God, will you help *these students* dwell more deeply in the good news of Jesus Christ as they

study this year?

All: We will, and we ask God to help us.

Pastor: Students, now receive the cross, the sign of the gospel, the good news of God's love for us and for all

creation, on your body and in your heart, that you may grow in your knowledge of the Lord and the

power of the resurrection.

(Sponsors mark the sign of the cross on or over each student as indicated.)

Pastor: Receive the sign of the Holy Cross on your forehead. It is Christ who strengthens you with this sign of

love. Learn to know and learn to follow Christ. Receive the sign of the holy cross on your heart, that Christ may dwell there by faith. Receive the sign of the holy cross on your hands, that Christ may be known in the work which you do. May you continue to grow in faith and discover the joy of God's love

for you throughout this year, in the name of the Father, and of the Son ₱, and of the Holy Spirit.

Students: Amen.

Pastor: Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you that you have made us your own by water and the Word in

baptism. You have called us to yourself, enlightened us with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished us in the community of faith. Uphold these students and all your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of

Christ.

Asst: With the whole church, we confess our faith:


All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.




## **Offering Prayer**


# **Great Thanksgiving - Grace Before the Meal**



## Holy Communion - the Lord's Supper

All are welcome at Christ's table regardless of age or membership status. All communion servers will have sanitized their hands before handling the communion elements. Ushers will direct you to come forward. The pastor and assisting minister will distribute the bread (gluten-free) and the other servers will distribute the wine (red) or grape juice (white). Individually packaged gluten free wafers and sets of completely sealed elements (wheat wafer and grape juice) are available on the stands near the bread distributors. You may pick one of those up yourself, if you prefer. You may place your empty cup in the baskets on the tables as you return to your seat.

If you would prefer not to receive communion, you are invited to come forward for a blessing. Please cross your arms over your chest to indicate your preference to the servers.



## Hearing Aid Compatible Assistive Listening System



- 1. Use this QR code connect to the "pop listen" Wi-fi network.
- 2. Use this QR © Code to download the *Listen EveryWhere* app, either from the Apple Store or the Google Play Store.



- 3. On your phone go to your settings. Tap on Connections, tap on Wi-fi, look for the "pop\_listen" network and tap on it.
- 4. Then find your "Listen Everywhere" app, open it and tap on "POP Service"
- 5. After that you should be receiving audio in your hearing aids. If you need assistance, see an Usher.
