Each year from September 1 to October 4, the Christian family unites for this worldwide celebration of prayer and action to protect our common home. It is a special season where we celebrate God as Creator and acknowledge

Creation as the divine continuing act that summons us as collaborators to love and care for the gift of all that is created. As followers of Christ from around the globe, we share a common call to care for Creation. We are co-

creatures and part of all that God has made. Our well-being is interwoven with the well-being of the Earth.

We rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all beings who share it. This year, the theme for the season is "Peace with Creation."

We recognize that our faith community gathers on the ancestral lands of the Tsartlip/WJOŁEŁP, Tseycum/WSIKEM, Tsawout/STÁUTW, & Pauquachin/BOKEĆEN Nations. In a spirit of gratitude and respect, we seek a growing relationship that fosters healing and hope for all our relations on these islands and inlets of the Salish Sea

Greeting and Call to Worship

One: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **All: Amen.**

One: Come, let us worship God, the Creator of all things, who calls us to dwell in peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and in quiet resting places.

All: We gather in gratitude for God's creation, longing for justice and peace to abide in the land.

One: Come, let us follow the Lord Jesus Christ, who reconciles all things and leads us in the way of righteousness, so that the wilderness may become a fruitful field and the fruitful field be deemed a forest.

All: We come to walk in the footSteps of Christ, seeking healing for creation and peace for all people.

One: Come, let us move with the Holy Spirit, the breath of life, who is poured out upon us, bringing renewal to the earth and restoring the harmony of Creation.

All: We praise God, who revives the land and calls us to be peacemakers with all of Creation.

One: The effect of righteousness will be peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever.

All: God of justice and peace, we gather in Your presence, united with all living beings. We come in hope, in worship, and in commitment to live as caretakers of Your world.

One: May our prayers rise like incense, and our worship be a song of love for all Creation.

All: We thank the Lord for giving life to all Creation! We thank God for our neighbours' life, human and non-human alike.

One: As we gather, we share the hope and the sufferings of our sisters and brothers in the whole Creation.

All: In communion with the waves of the sea, with the waves of the trees, we recite Psalm 139:14 together: "I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made." We love you, God! Amen.


