<u>The Big Idea</u>: People will either stumble over Jesus or build their lives upon Him. God's design for His people is that we tell the world who He is. We exist to display and proclaim God's excellence to the world. We are royal priests — called to point people to and declare the glories of our God and King.

This passage deals with two questions: "Who is Jesus?" and "Who are we?"

1 Peter 2:4-10 (ESV)

2 ⁴ As you come to him, a living stone <u>rejected by men</u> but in the sight of God <u>chosen and</u>

⁵ you yourselves like <u>living stones</u> are <u>being built up as a spiritual house</u>, to be a <u>holy priesthood</u>, to offer <u>spiritual sacrifices</u> acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

⁶ For it stands in Scripture: "Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone,

a <u>cornerstone</u> <u>chosen and</u> <u>precious</u>,

and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

WHO IS JESUS?

"a living stone" (v. 4)

The one we go "through" to connect to God the Father (v. 5)

WHO ARE WE?

"living stones"

"spiritual house" (v.5)

We are those who "believe in Him" (vv. 6-7

⁷ So the <u>honor is for you who</u> <u>believe</u>, but <u>for those who</u> <u>do not believe</u>,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,"

8 and

"A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense."

They stumble because they <u>disobey</u> the word, as they were destined to do.

⁹ But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

¹⁰ Once you were <u>not a people</u>, but now <u>you are God's people</u>; once you <u>had not received mercy</u>, but now you have received mercy.

- But clearly not all believe. Some are those who reject Jesus (v. 7). To them, Jesus is a
