
The Anglican Church of St. John the Divine Holy Cross Day Season of Creation September 14, 2025





But we turn against you, and betray your trust; and we turn against one another. Again and again you call us to return. Through the prophets and sages you reveal your righteous law. By his death he opened to us the way of freedom and peace.

All: Glory to you for ever and ever.


Pour out your Spirit upon the whole earth and make it your new creation.

All are invited to receive communion. Receiving bread or wine is considered full communion. It is the practice of the ACC not to dip the bread into the wine. Any not receiving communion are invited to receive a blessing, and to indicate that by holding their arms crossed on their chest.

If you are unable to come to a communion station please make this known to the Greeters and we will bring communion to you.

Gluten free wafers for communion are available. Please request them from the person who is distributing the bread.
