
Rev. Karen Hollis will be on study leave this Sunday. We thank the Rev. Trevor Malkinson for leading us in worship.

As one of three commissioners of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, Marie Wilson criss-crossed Canada for six years, documenting the history and lasting impacts of the Canadian Indian residential school system. She has recently written a book, North of Nowhere, and will be speaking at Comox United following worship on Sunday, September 21, from 11:30 am to 12:30 pm. There will also be time afterward for conversation around the book sales table. To tide us over, a bit of extra nourishment — buns, cheese and veggie trays — will be available during our regular coffee time.

On Monday, September 29 at 7 p.m., we will be screening the Academy Award-nominated documentary Sugarcane. It is a groundbreaking investigation into an Indian residential school, shedding light on years of forced separation, assimilation and abuse that Indigenous children experienced at the hands of Church and government. This urgent and timely film brings the hidden story of cultural genocide to audiences worldwide while





celebrating the resilience of Native people as they work to overcome cycles of intergenerational trauma.

Council: The Governing Body of our Community of Faith

Our Church Council is like the board of Comox United Church. It is made up of a chair, secretary, treasurer, the chair of the Ministry & Personnel Committee, the chair of the Trustees, and individuals from other committees and members-at-large. Also, the minister must be present at Council meetings in order to pass motions. Currently our Council has 13 members.

Council meets once a month except in July. Here is a taste of what happens at our meetings.

At our August Council meeting:


- We endorsed a grant application that the Affirming committee is submitting to the ProVision Fund for their 2026 community outreach activities.
- We discussed copyright and SOCAN fees, and who is responsible for these when an outside group holds a concert in our building it's more complicated than you think.
- We made a small change to the Communication Policy which will result in more events being listed in the newsletter and on our website.
- We discussed the need for a multi-year property maintenance plan and budget, which is the responsibility of a Property committee chair, but we don't currently have anyone in that role. Interested?

Exploring Natural and Conservation Burial Sunday, Sept 21 at 10 a.m.

How can natural and conservation burial bring new life to the earth after we are gone? A special presentation at Nikkei No Haka Japanese Cemetery in Cumberland will consider the impacts of disposition/interment of our body for the earth and all her creatures, re-imagining together old and simple ways that bring our bodies back into the circle of life. There will be a facilitated walk between two cemeteries, an informative handout, questions and discussions, and an opportunity to meet other folks interested in growing natural/conservation burial opportunities in this community. Let's explore the impacts of modern technological forms of decomposition of the body, while taking a deeper dive into how natural and conservation burial practices are viable and possible choices right now.

Explore "Forest Bathing" with Tamiko Suzuki

On Sunday, October 5th at Comox United, the Unitarian service at 4 pm will feature a presentation by Tamiko Suzuki, an active longtime member of the Environment Team with Vancouver Unitarians. Tamiko will reprise her Earth Day service (because every day is Earth Day) to talk about *shinrin yoko*, or Forest Bathing, and her journey to becoming a Forest Therapy Guide. The walks she leads aim to reconnect participants with themselves and with Nature. In this service everyone will be invited to use their senses and imagination to join in an imaginary walk in the forest.
