ORDER OF WORSHIP

Time for Centering

This morning, we begin a new sermon series on a collection of psalms known as the Psalms of Ascent. These psalms—120 through 134—were pilgrim songs, sung by Israel as they made their way up to Jerusalem for the great feasts. They are sometimes called "songs for the road," and they are perfectly suited for us as disciples of Jesus, because the Christian life is itself a journey. Discipleship is not about arriving all at once, but about walking with God step by step, learning to trust Him across all the varied terrain of life. These psalms give voice to the whole range of what that journey feels like—the joy and anticipation, but also the weariness, the longing, and the struggles along the way. They remind us that God meets us not only in the temple or on the mountaintop, but also in the valleys, in the ordinary days, and even in the places of deep distress.

Our series through these psalms will take us on this journey together, tracing the path of discipleship as it unfolds in song. And it all begins with Psalm 120. This first psalm of ascent doesn't begin with celebration or arrival, but with lament. It doesn't open with shouts of joy or praise, but with an acknowledgment of disillusionment. The psalmist cries out from a place of trouble, surrounded by lies and conflict. That's where discipleship always starts—by facing the truth about where we really are and lifting our cry to the Lord. Before we can ascend, we must first acknowledge our need for God's rescue. Psalm 120 reminds us that the journey of faith begins in honesty and dependence, and it sets our feet on the path that leads us upward, closer to God and to His peace.

Jesus echoes this same invitation in Matthew 11:28–30:

"Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me—watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly." (The Message)



Legacy Endowment Fund – current balance \$366,320

The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to expand and enrich the mission of the congregation, to initiate new ministries or significantly change the scope of existing ministries. No more than 5% of the three year average fund assets may be distributed in any one year.

Memorial Garden Fund – current balance \$480,296

The purpose of the Memorial Garden Fund is to provide for the perpetual operation and maintenance of the Memorial Garden. Established in 1990, the Memorial Garden provides a resting place for the interment of the ashes of loved ones. It is open to current and former members and residents of Rio and Tonto Verde.

Scholarship Fund – current balance \$15,148

The Scholarship Fund promotes scholarships among young people involved in institutions we support through Mission giving. Recipients are chosen from applicants who are demonstrating academic excellence, commitment, and service in or to one of the following non-profit institutions or community: Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), NPH (formerly Friends of the Orphans), Sunshine Acres. The Scholarship Fund's sole support is contributions from our members. Donors cannot be related to recipients.

Did you know?... If you are age 70 1/2 or older, you can make a gift from your IRA to support the church. It will not add to your federal taxable income; It counts toward your required minimum distribution, and allows you to experience a tax benefit, even if you do not itemize deductions. You should discuss any such gifts, before making them, with your financial advisor.

The church is very appreciative of gifts from trusts, foundations, and stocks. Occasionally, these gifts are received with no indication of who the donor is. So that we may properly recognize and record the gift, we ask that you either notify the church office or have your financial representative document the donor {and intent} when it is sent to us.


