Keep Yourselves in the Love of God

Jude 17-25

"Keep yourselves in the love of God." Jude 21

"Jude, a servant of Jesus Christ and brother of James, to those who are called, **beloved in God the Father** and kept for Jesus Christ." Jude 1

There is a battle that we all face in this world seeking us to draw us away from a close, intimate, and sacred relationship with God and it is our collective responsibility to help each other keep ourselves in the love of God.

I. Anticipate False Teaching: Expect False Teachers to Distort the Grace of God and to Deny the Lordship of Christ.

"But you must remember, beloved, the predictions of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ. They said to you, 'In the last time there will be scoffers, following their ungodly passions.' It is these who cause divisions, worldly people, devoid of the Spirit." Jude 17-18

"For certain people have crept in unnoticed who long ago were designated for this condemnation, ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into sensuality and deny our only Master and Our Lord Jesus Christ." Jude 3-4

• They pervert the grace of God in order to promote sin.

"What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it?" Romans 6:1-2

They deny the exclusivity and supremacy of Christ.

II. Collaborate with Fellow Believers : Read and Plead Together

"But you beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith and praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life." Jude 20-21

Read the Word Together

III. <u>Be Your Brother's Keeper: Commit Yourself to Helping Your Struggling Brothers or Sisters in Christ.</u>

"And have mercy on those who doubt; Save others by snatching them out of the fire; to others show mercy with fear, hating even the garment stained by sin." Jude 22-23

IV. <u>Magnify the Lord Together: Together Make Much of the Saving Power of Jesus.</u>

"Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of His glory with great joy, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord be glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen." Jude 24-25

"The doxology reminds readers of the heart and soul of the Christian life... Their faithfulness until the end is not due to their own nobility or inner strength. God himself keeps his own from falling away. He grants the ability to stand before God blameless and joyful on the last day." Tom Schreiner

Study Questions:

1. What warnings does Jude give about false teachers, and how should believers respond to these dangers?

- Focus: Anticipating false teaching (Jude 17–18; Jude 3–4; Romans 6:1–2)
- Application: Why is it important to stay grounded in sound doctrine, and how can we recognize when grace is being distorted?

2. How does collaboration with fellow believers help us remain in the love of God?

• Focus: Reading and praying together (Jude 20–21; 2 Timothy 4:1–4)

• Application: In what ways can you build yourself and others up in faith through Scripture and Spirit-led prayer?

3. What responsibilities do we have toward fellow Christians who are struggling or doubting?

- Focus: Being your brother's keeper (Jude 22–23; James 5:19–20)
- Application: How can we show mercy while maintaining a healthy reverence for the danger of sin?

4. How does Jude's doxology (vv. 24–25) shape our understanding of God's role in keeping us faithful?

- Focus: Magnifying the Lord together
- Application: What comfort and motivation can we draw from knowing that it is God who ultimately keeps us from stumbling?
