

Commemorations of the church:

Wednesday, September 17

Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen, died 1179

A mystic who was widely influential within the church, Hildegard advised and reproved kings and popes, wrote poems and hymns, and produced treatises in medicine, theology, and natural history. She was also a musician and artist.

Thursday, September 18

Dag Hammarskjöld, renewer of society, died 1961

A Swedish diplomat, Hammarskjöld served as the second Secretary General of the United Nations until his death in a plane crash while trying to negotiate peace in present-day Zambia. His journal, published as Markings, revealed the depth of his Christian faith.

Saturday, September 20

Nelson Wesley Trout, bishop, died 1996 (TFF)

A native of Ohio, Trout served parishes in several parts of the United States before being elected bishop of the South Pacific District of the American Lutheran Church, the first African American Lutheran to serve in such a capacity.

Sunday, September 20th

Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist

Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were frequently despised for dishonesty and for assisting the occupiers. Jesus nevertheless showed love for them, and chose Matthew to be a disciple.

- Medium size sturdy boxes, which we use for mailing.


You may put your donations in the bin designated "LWR/Health Kits Items" in the Narthex, or leave on bench in office.



Health and Wholeness -Covid Information

COVID-19 (Coronavirus infectious disease 2019) caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus continues to be present in our community, with cases rising this summer. With fall and winter coming and people indoors more of the time, cases are expected to rise. Health care professionals are recommending that folks without a contraindication should get an updated COVID-19 vaccine now. The vaccine is now available in pharmacies. The Washington state Department of Health just passed a rule that a prescription is not required to get the vaccine. So, getting a COVID shot is no more difficult than getting flu (influenza) or RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) vaccines. There are several COVID vaccines available. Below is the statement from the Department of Health.

Provider Alert: Washington State DOH Issues a Standing Order for People 6 Months and Older to receive the 2025-2026 COVID-19 vaccine

Date: September 15, 2025

On September 4, 2025, the Washington State Department of Health has issued a statewide order allowing all residents aged 6 months and older to receive a 2025-2026 COVID-19 vaccine, regardless of health status.

Current Situation:

- The Washington State Department of Health (DOH) continues to recommend that everyone 6 months and older, including pregnant people, stay up to date with the current COVID-19 vaccine to help protect against severe illness, long COVID, hospitalization, and death. DOH recently issued a statewide standing order for COVID-19 vaccines that authorizes qualified health care providers including doctors, pharmacists, and nurses to administer the most up-to-date versions of the COMIRNATY, MNEXSPIKE, SPIKEVAX, and NUVAXOVID vaccines to everyone ages 6 months and older, including pregnant individuals, who do not have contraindications to the vaccine. Refer to DOH COVID-19 Vaccine Schedule.
- The standing order supports DOH's recommendation that all people 6 months and older receive the COVID vaccine and is supported by recommendations from trusted national medical organizations such as the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the American Academy of Family Physicians. The standing order removes a barrier to accessing COVID-19 vaccines, but other challenges remain. o COVID-19 vaccines remain covered by most private insurers, Apple Health, and Washington's Adult Vaccine and Childhood Vaccine Programs.
- Patients do not need to provide documentation that they are "high-risk" if they receive the COVID-19 vaccine in Washington State. The standing order authorizes the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine to anyone 6 months and older including pregnant individuals if there are no contraindications.

Actions Requested:

- Recommend COVID-19 vaccination for all individuals 6 months and older without a contraindication, including pregnant people.
- A recommendation from a healthcare professional is one of the strongest drivers of vaccine uptake.
- Maintain 2025-2026 COVID-19 vaccine inventory.
- Ordering for COVID-19 vaccines through the Washington Childhood and Adult Vaccine Programs will likely open between the end of September and early October. Review the standing order and FAQs and share with your networks as appropriate.
- Administer COVID-19 vaccine at the same time as other vaccines during a visit, such as giving COVID-19 and flu vaccines at the same time. · Address questions from patients about WA DOH's COVID-19 vaccine standing order.

Background:

Since 2021, COVID-19 vaccines have been recommended for all individuals 6 months and older who do not have contraindications to the vaccine. On August 27 the FDA approved 2025-2026 COVID-19 vaccines, but limited COVID-19 vaccine authorizations to those 65 and older, and those with at least one condition that puts them at high risk for severe outcomes from COVID-19. National medical organizations, some state and local health departments (including DOH and Public Health – Seattle & King County), continue to recommend COVID-19 vaccination for all people ages 6 months and above. Staying up to date with the current COVID-19 vaccines help protect against severe illness, hospitalization, long COVID, and death.






ELCC (Eastside Lutheran Church Community) churches, the Synod and the ELCA:
