ALL SAINTS BY-THE-SEA

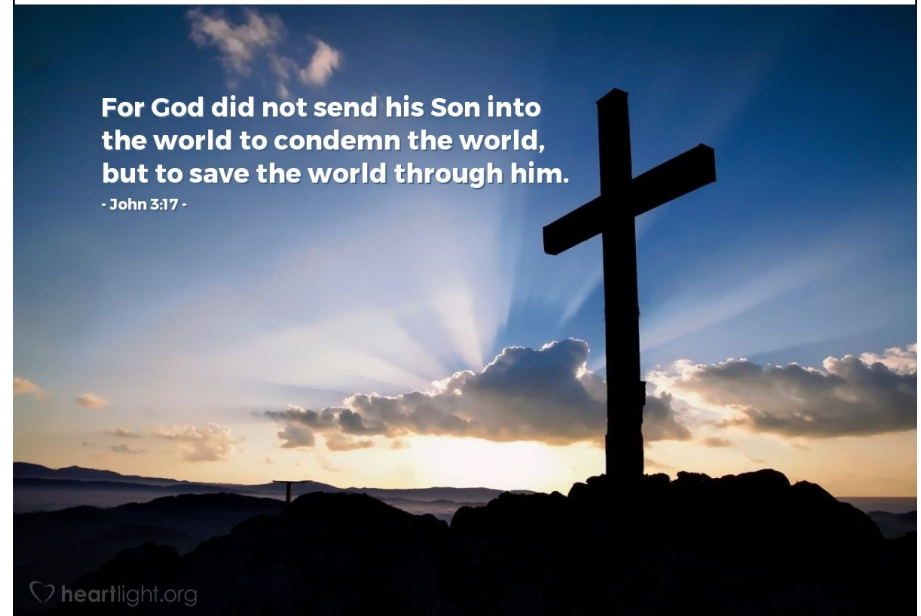
Shiya'hwt • SYOWT • Ganges Village

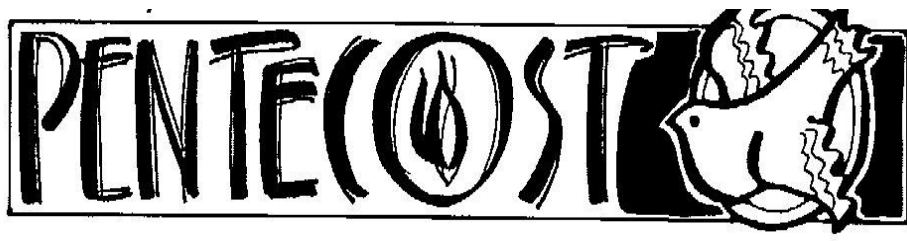

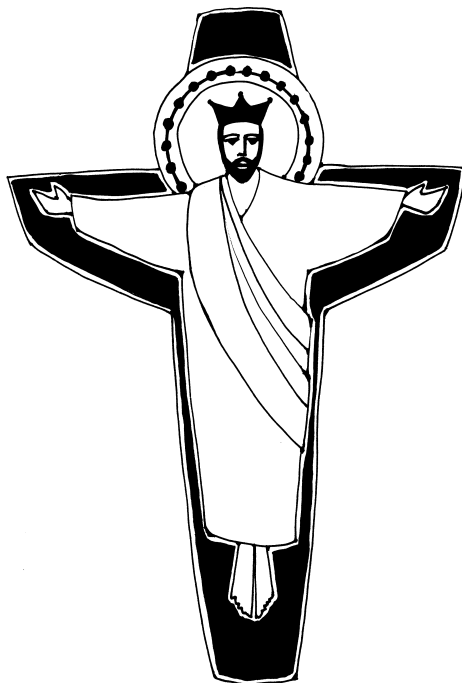
