# **Tainted**

What do we value more - friendship or money?

Use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity (Luke 16).

What is friendship?

Why don't we try this:

All kinds of things rejoiced my soul in their company - to talk and laugh, and to do each other kindnesses.

To read pleasant books together. To pass from lightest jesting to talk of the deepest things and back again.

To differ without rancour, as a man might differ with himself, and when, most rarely, dissension arose, to find our normal agreement all the sweeter for it.

To be impatient for the return of the absent, and to welcome them with joy on their home-coming.

These, and such-like things, proceeding from our hearts as we gave affection and received it back, and shown by face, by voice, by the eyes, and by a thousand other pleasing ways, kindled a flame which fused our very souls together, and, of many, made us one (St. Augustine, Confessions, IV, X, 13)

Let's put down the phones and seek genuine friendships. They will lead us to heaven.




