Rector's Corner

"Do you know what you are?" I asked the children.

What would their answers be? I thought that someone would say, "I'm a girl." Or "I'm a boy." Or "I am a human." Or "I'm a hockey fan." Or "I'm a dancer."

I had hardly finished getting the words out when Madilyn's hand shot up. "Do you know what you are?" I asked again. She nodded and said, "The child of God."

WOW! That was exactly the answer I was hoping for! Out of the mouths of babes, as we say. In those four words, Madilyn said what we all need to know, deep down in our hearts. She spoke to our primary need as human beings – to know that we are loved and that we belong.

The thing is, we often confuse our identity with what we do. Do you know what you are? I am a teacher; a dairy farmer; a paramedic; a business person; a priest; a personal support worker. These depend on our abilities.

Do you know what you are? If you said, "I am a mother"; or "I am a brother"; or "I am a grandmother", you are closer to the real answer. But there is still another level. What helps me to understand my role as a parent or grandparent, sister or brother, Aunt or Uncle?My relationship with God.

You see, my relationship with the Lord does not depend on what I can do. Nor does it depend on whether I am married, or have children. It does not even depend on how many people I have in my family. My relationship with the Lord depends on His goodness and grace, and my acceptance of His Son by faith.

In His Loving-kindness and Mercy, the Lord adopted you as His own child when you were baptized. There is nothing that you and I did to deserve that. He looked graciously upon us because of what His blessed Son, Jesus Christ, did for us on the Cross.

A couple of Sundays ago, St. Paul said, "We are not sufficient of ourselves to think anything of ourselves; our sufficiency is from God." (2 Corinthians 3.4) This sums up the truth about what we are – our identity. Jobs and people will fail us, and circumstances and abilities will change; but the "The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3. 22-23) Alleluia!
