1. Read Matthew 28:16-18. What's the significance of Jesus designating where His disciples were to go, some worshipping Him there, and His statement in verse 18?

2. Read Matthew 28:19-20. What would be the significance of the word "therefore" in verse 19?

The main verb in these verses is the "make" in "make disciples. It is in the imperative (command) form. Why is doing this difficult?

How would you define a disciple?
