3	Read 1 Samuel 8:19-20. In what ways are we tempted (or do we) as Christians to take our cues about God's Kingdom, and leadership from the world around us rather than from God?		
4	Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13. Combined with 1 Samuel 13:14, what made David different? Why do you think everyone around him seemed to miss it?		
5	According to 1 Samuel 13:14, why was Saul rejected, and what would be different about the new king? What kind of King/Person is God looking for?		
6	We usually spend more time on our exterior (appearance, skills, talents, accomplishments) than our interior (values and integrity). Why do you think that is? Why will that approach eventually backfire?		
7	David was a man after God's own heart, but he was a man that chased God, God was in his heart. Is God in youthrough faith in Jesus? And is God in you, in the sense that God's life is being lived through you? How?




1 Samuel 16:1-13

David Anointed King

1The Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul, since I have rejected him from being king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil, and go. I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." 2And Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears it, he will kill me." And the Lord said, "Take a heifer with you and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the Lord.' 3And invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do. And you shall anoint for me him whom I declare to you." 4Samuel did what the Lord commanded and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling and said, "Do you come peaceably?" 5And he said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the Lord. Consecrate yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice." And he consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice. 6When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is before him." 7But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." 8Then Jesse called Abinadab and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." 9Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." 10And Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen these." 11Then Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but behold, he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and get him, for we will not sit down till he comes here." 12And he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy and had beautiful eyes and was handsome. And the Lord said, "Arise, anoint him, for this is he." 13Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers. And the Spirit of the Lord rushed upon David from that day forward. And Samuel rose up and went to Ramah. David in Saul's Service 14 Now the Spirit of the Lord departed from Saul, and a harmful spirit from the Lord tormented him. 15And Saul's servants said to him, "Behold now, a harmful spirit from God is tormenting you. 16Let our lord now command your servants who are before you to seek out a man who is skillful in playing the lyre, and when the harmful spirit from God is upon you, he will play it, and you will be well."

Jesus Is Tested in the Wilderness
Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, where
for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of
them he was hungry. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become
bread." Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone." The devil led him up
to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to
him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to
anyone I want to. If you worship me, it will all be yours." Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship
the Lord your God and serve him only." The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on
the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from
here. For it is written: "'He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully







