Introduction

- "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25).
- Because Christ lives, we have assurance that our loved one who believed in Him lives too.
- Take Away: Hope is not a concept; Hope is a Person—Jesus.

3. Our Inheritance Is Eternally secured

- Heaven is not a fading dream but a promised reality.
- "And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying..." (Revelation 21:4)
- We honor our loved one's life, but we also rejoice because their eternal inheritance is safe with Christ.

Closing Word

- Death does not have the final word—Christ does.
- The grave is not the end—it is a passage into glory.
- For us who remain, this is both a comfort and a call: to live in the light of eternity.

Prophetic Declaration:

- Because Christ is alive, death has no victory.
- Because Christ is our hope, we will see our loved ones again.
- And because Christ reigns, we live today with confidence that death is not the end!
