

"The Good & the Bad"

As I write this Newsletter, we are in the heat of summer; the lower to mid-90's. Here in Indiana we all know that the weather can change quickly. We are blessed with the four seasons of the year. Some love it and then there are those that don't. But we have no choice but to take the good and the bad.

In everyday life we have the same, good and bad. Have you ever asked the question; Why does God allow bad things to happen to good people? If we've never asked it, most of us have thought about it. This is one of the most difficult questions in all theology. We all know that God is sovereign. So, if this is so, then all that happens is known by God and must have at least been allowed by Him. One of many examples of this is in the Bible, where David and Bathsheba's infant son died. The child was sick, and David pleaded and begged God to spare his son, but the Lord allowed his son to die. There is a whole lot more to this story, but a bad thing happened to a good person, even though he was a sinner like us.

Because we are human, we cannot expect to fully understand God's purposes and ways. The Bible tells us this; "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord" (Isaiah 55:8).

We all know about Job's life that is described to us in the Old Testament. Job was a righteous man. He and his family must have asked over and over again, why does God allow bad things to happen to good people. But on this side of heaven, we will not have all the answers to that question. But what we do know is that the Lord is good all the time and that He is always with us. The Bible tells us this; "The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in him" (Nahum 1:7). Job was a man that trusted in God. "In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil" (Job 1:1). Even though this was

true, he suffered in ways that are almost beyond belief. We see throughout the Book of Job, that God allowed Satan to do everything he wanted to Job except kill him. What was Job's response to all these bad things happening to him? "Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him, I will surely defend my ways to his face" (Job 13:15).

Job may have not known why God allowed these things to happen to him, but he knew God was good and therefore continued to trust in Him. Ultimately, that should be our reaction as well.

Another good example in the Bible is the story of Joseph and how his brothers did some bad things to him. When you have time, read his story again and see how God turned bad into good. Listen to what Joseph told his brothers at the end of his story. "But Joseph said to them, 'Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. So then, don't be afraid. I will provide for you and your children.' And he reassured them and spoke kindly to them" (Genesis 50:19-21).

God allows things to happen for a reason. Whether or not we understand His reasons, we must remember that God is good all the time. He is just, loving, and merciful.

Let us walk by faith, not by sight!
