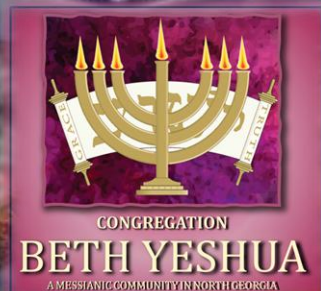

Tishrei 1 – New Year's [Honoring His Creation]



The sages teach that Rosh Hashanah traditionally honors the Creation of the World. The rabbis noted something interesting about the Hebrew word *bereshit* (**בְּרֵאשִׁית** in the beginning), which is the very first word in the Torah and begins the account of the creation. It becomes, when one rearranges the letters, the 1st of Tishri—the date on which the New Year, Rosh HaShanah, falls—*Tishri One* (**א' בִּתְשִׁירִי**).

The letters of *bereshit* [Gen. 1:1] **בְּרֵאשִׁית** become **א** [1st] of **בִּתְשִׁירִי** [Tishri]

For the Jewish people, the festival of Rosh Hashanah, therefore, reflects – or is *witness to* – the creation. The festival is a ‘fixed time’ – a “sign in time” – that witnesses to something “outside of time,” where we are drawn out of the reality of everyday experience and into the reality of the eternal.

Malkhuyot (Kingship)



- This day focuses on the kingship of God and our acceptance of His reign over us and over His creation
- It reminds us that the most important meditation for this day is to renew our hearts to God's sovereignty over all things
- The shofar blast as part and parcel of Yom T'ruah, can be heard as a trumpet heralding and crowning God as king – it brings us back to Mount Sinai

Tishrei 1 – Day of Judgment



The central theme of Rosh Hashanah is to remember that God is our Creator, our King, and therefore our Righteous Judge. Since we are His creation, and He is our source of life, we have a duty to serve Him as our King and live before Him as our Judge. Every person that has ever lived will necessarily face judgment one day.

The Mishnah teaches that all nations pass before the King and are judged on Rosh Hashanah, and their final verdict is sealed on Yom Kippur.

Books were opened; and another book was opened, the Book of Life; and the dead were judged from what was written in the books, according to what they had done. ¹³ The sea gave up the dead in it; and Death and Sh'ol gave up the dead in them; and they were judged, each according to what he had done.

Zichronot (Remembrance)



- God remembers all of creation and every individual's actions throughout the year
- God is a loving and intimate God, who also remembers His eternal covenant of love for His people, “to be their God, and they to be His people”
- We remember who we are in relationship to God, and who God is in relationship to us...and we remember who judges our hearts and our lives
- We are to remember to judge our own lives, to assess how well we are aligning our lives, our purpose, our mission and all we do to God’s purpose, His mission...partnering with Him in bringing His redemption to creation

Tishrei 1 – Day of Remembrance



For the Jewish people, Rosh HaShanah is a time for remembering God's faithfulness to Israel through history. That is why the Jewish people recite the Shelosh Esre Midot—The Thirteen Attributes of Mercy. These are the words that God brought to Moses in Exodus 34: 6-7 after the incident of the Golden Calf.

Yom haZikhron is also a time for personal and communal reflection – remembering the past year: how well did I live this year in faithfulness to His covenant and in justice toward my fellow man? How do I repent for my misdeeds and turn back to God in faithfulness? How do I give back to God and others in the coming year?

Shofrot (Shofar Blasts)



- This portion centers on the shofar and its significance both throughout Jewish history, but also today and in looking forward to the time of redemption
- It references the shofar blast at Mount Sinai, when the Torah was given, and looks forward to the blast that will announce the Messiah's arrival
- The shofar's sound symbolizes divine revelation, redemption, and a call for us to awaken spiritually

Tishrei 1 – Day of Shofar Blowing



Exodus 19

¹ In the third month after the people of Isra'el had left the land of Egypt, the same day they came to the Sinai Desert. ² After setting out from Refidim and arriving at the Sinai Desert, they set up camp in the desert; there in front of the mountain, Isra'el set up camp. ³ Moshe went up to God, and *ADONAI* called to him from the mountain: "Here is what you are to say to the household of Ya'akov, to tell the people of Isra'el:

Exodus 19

⁴ ‘You have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I carried you on eagles’ wings and brought you to myself. ⁵ Now if you will pay careful attention to what I say and keep my covenant, **then you will be my own treasure from among all the peoples, for all the earth is mine; ⁶ and you will be a kingdom of *cohanim* for me, a nation set apart.**’ These are the words you are to speak to the people of Isra’el.”

Exodus 19

¹⁶ On the morning of the third day, there was thunder, lightning and a thick cloud on the mountain. **Then a *SHOFAR BLAST* sounded so loudly that all the people in the camp trembled.** ¹⁷ Moshe brought the people out of the camp to meet God; they stood near the base of the mountain. ¹⁸ Mount Sinai was enveloped in smoke, because *ADONAI* descended onto it in fire — its smoke went up like the smoke from a furnace, and the whole mountain shook violently. ¹⁹ **As the sound of the *shofar* grew louder and louder, Moshe spoke; and God answered him with a voice.**

The Mystery of Yom T'ruah



The Torah does not reveal what the purpose of this holy day is – other than to say it is a day to be remembered by the blowing of the shofar

1 Corinthians 15



⁵¹ Look, I will tell you **a secret** [Gr: musterion]—not all of us will die! But we will all be changed! ⁵² It will take but a moment, the blink of an eye, **at the final shofar. For the shofar will sound**, and the dead will be raised to live forever, and we too will be changed.

1 Thessalonians 4



¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven **with a rousing cry**, with **a call** from one of the ruling angels, and **with God's *shofar***; those who died united with the Messiah will be the first to rise; ¹⁷ then we who are left still alive will be caught up with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air; and thus we will always be with the Lord. ¹⁸ So encourage each other with these words.

The sounding of the shofar on Yom T'ruah is a wake-up blast -- a reminder that the time is near for Yom Kippur

It marks the beginning of the time of intense teshuvah (mourning, repentance, turning back to God)

Days of Awe

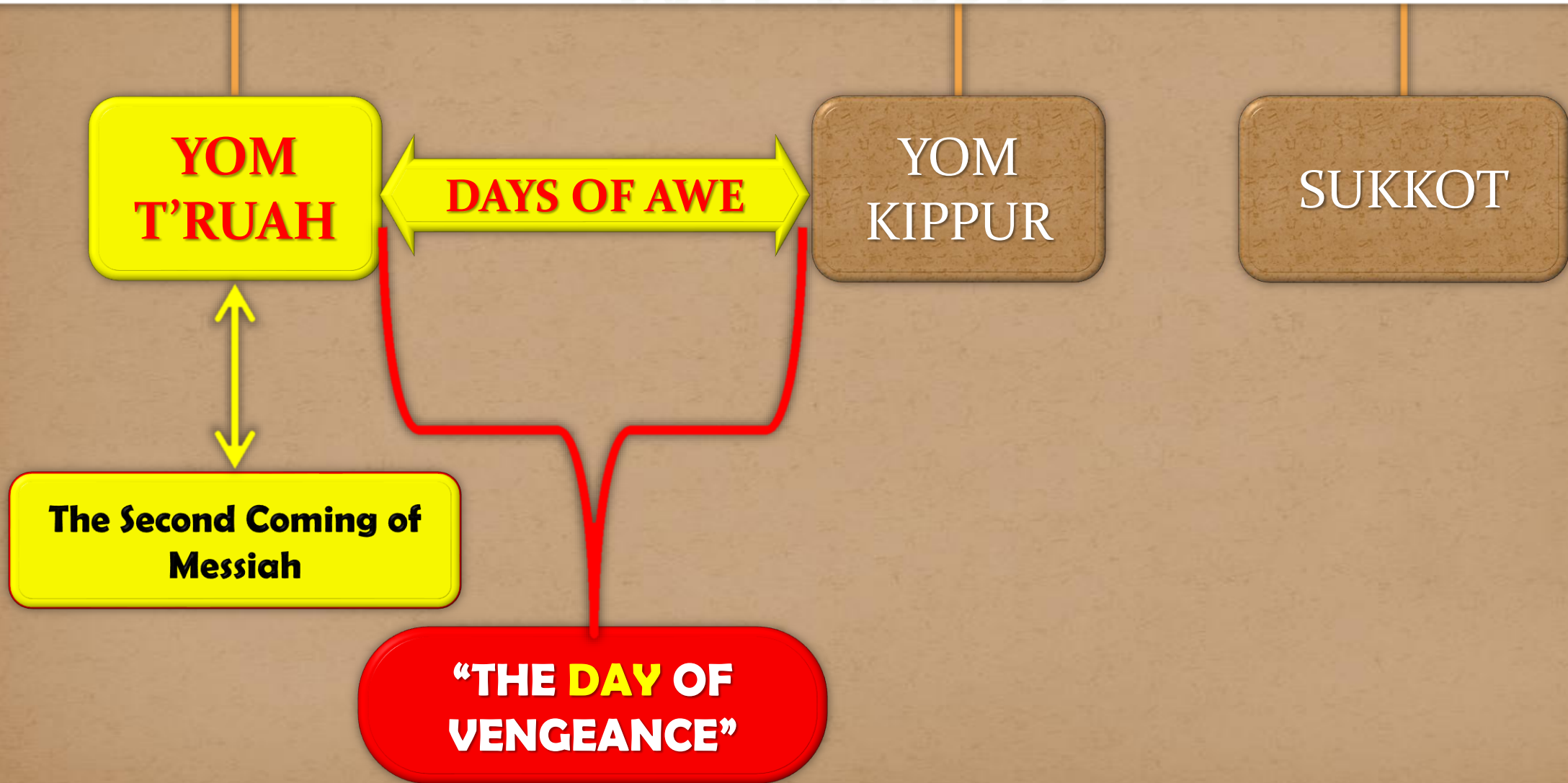


This period of T'Shuvah is called the 'Days of Awe' in Rabbinic Judaism and leads up to the holiest day of the Jewish calendar, Yom Kippur - the "Day Of Atonement"

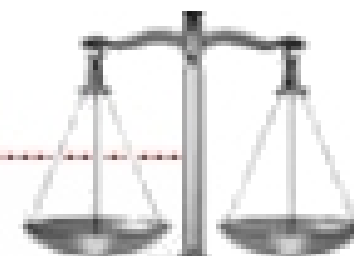

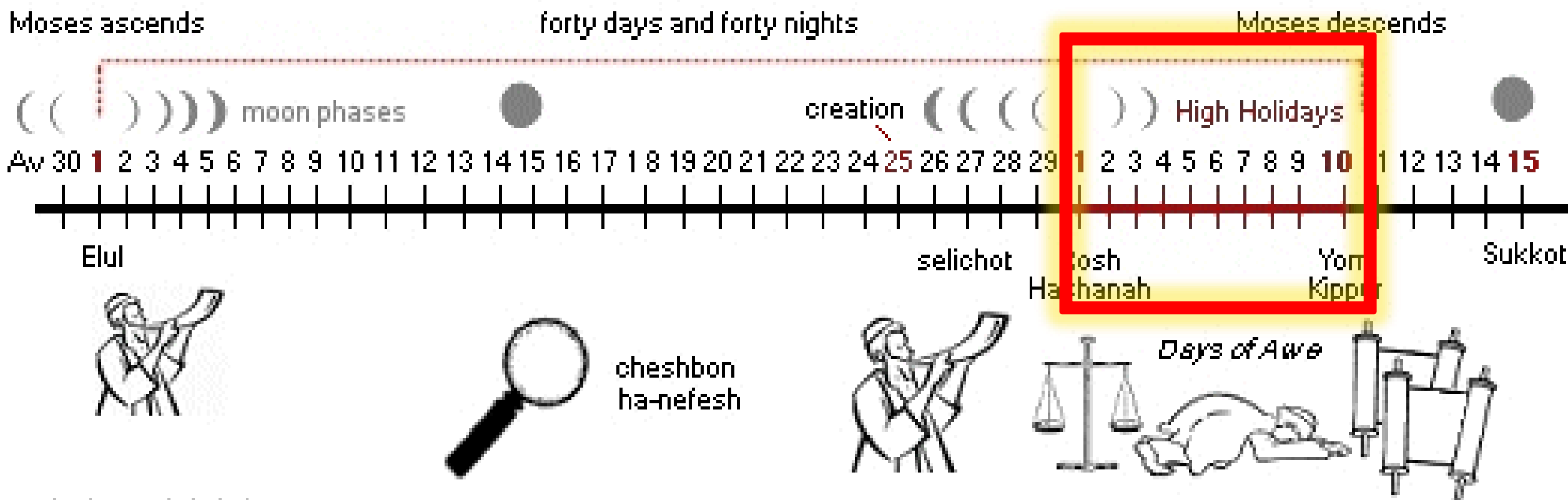
